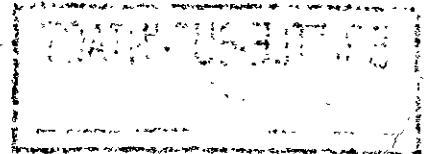

NAVAL CIVIL AFFAIRS PUBLICATIONS

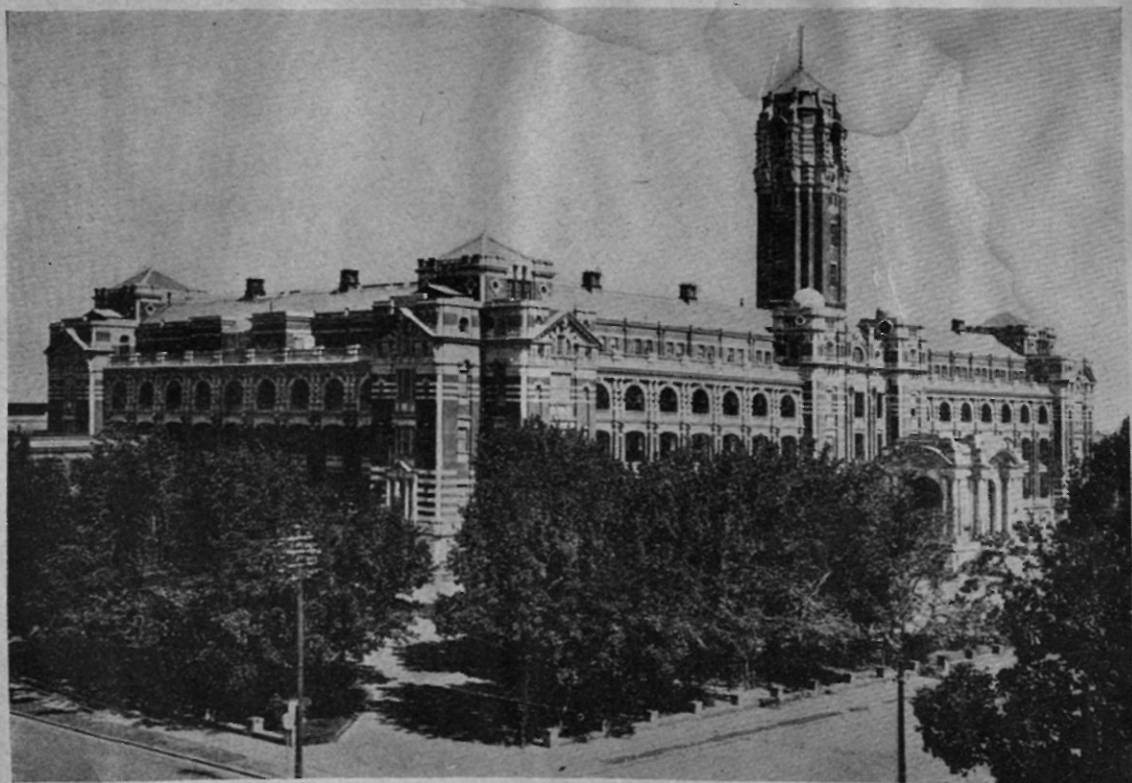

PREFACE

The body of this publication, Section II, is a translation of pages 751-814 of the *Register of Japanese Officials (Shokuin-roku)*, issued at Tokyo in 1939. This edition was selected because those of later years were cut drastically and include personnel organization on higher levels only. It is believed that the lower levels of the bureaucracy were little affected by shifts in the higher brackets.

The *Register of Japanese Officials* includes the names of all officials, numbering about 18,000. The translation and listing of individual names, however, has been deferred until the preparation of a "Who's Who" of Japanese in Taiwan.

Section I, the "Introduction" to OPNAV 50E-14, is a commentary which does not appear in the original Japanese document. Totals of personnel under the subdivisions of government have been added in appropriate places, as well as the tables which constitute Section III, the "Summary."

Section I

INTRODUCTION

1. POLITICAL DIVISIONS OF TAIWAN: TERMINOLOGY.

shū (州) Province (Taihoku, Shinchiku, Taichū, Tainan, Takao).

chō (廳) District (Taitō, Karenkō, Bōkō).
Geographically similar to the province but differs from it in details of administration. The governor, for instance, has somewhat less power than the governor of the province, being subject to greater control by the Chief of the Police Affairs Department of the Government-General.

gun (郡) May be translated roughly as county, though this term is to be avoided. Administrative - geographical division of the *shū*.

shichō (支廳) Bears the same relationship to the *chō* as the *gun* bears to the *shū*.

shi (市) Incorporated city. There are ten *shi* in Taiwan (Heitō, Takao, Kagi, Keelung, Makō, Shinchiku, Shōka, Taichū, Taihoku, and Tainan). The census reports of 1940 indicate that Giran and Karenkō were given the status of *shi* by an ordinance of 28 October 1940, but they are not being included with the *shi* in the present studies. All the *shi* with the exception of Takaō lie within the boundaries of some *gun*, but they are not under *gun* administration nor is the *shi* population counted in computing the population of the *gun*. The administrative offices of these *gun*, however, are located in the *shi*.

gai (街) The term *gai* has two meanings. It is used (1) to designate a single town. It also refers (2) to a larger administrative - geographical unit made up of the town (*gai*) plus a number of villages clustered around it. Thus the term Toyohara-*gai* refers both to the town of Toyohara and to the larger unit made up of Toyohara town and the ten surrounding villages.

shō (庄) The *shō* may be a single town or village, i.e., *Ryūkyū-shō*, *Tōkō-gun*, *Takao-shū*. More frequently, however, it is a cluster of villages with surrounding territory. One of the villages, usually with the same name as that of the *shō* as a whole, is the administrative center. This village is not necessarily the largest or most important of the group. Nor is the village which gives its name to the *shō* always the administrative center.

No one English word can adequately describe a *shō*. The word "village" has been used here for lack of a better term, though its inadequacy is revealed by the fact that a *shō* may comprise either one (rarely) or several (usually) populated places and include anywhere from 1 to over 8,000 inhabitants in a single-unit *shō* and as many as 28,000 in a composite *shō*. In many cases, the word "township" would be a much better approximation than "village" but it is not always appropriate. As in certain other cases, the difficulty of finding an English equivalent suggests the desirability of using the Japanese term instead of trying to find a suitable English equivalent.

The names of the component villages sometimes show a directional (compass) relationship to the *shō* as a whole. For instance, as an aid in locating the village of Denryō in *Enri-shō*, *Byōritsu-gun*, *Shinchiku-shū*, it will sometimes be listed as Enri South-East Denryō.

There frequently is one ideograph common to the names of all villages in the group making up the *shō*. For instance, *Shikō-shō* (四港庄) (Four Harbors-*shō*) in *Shinchiku-shū* is made up of four villages called *Nikō*, *Sankō*, *Shikō*, and *Gokō* (二港, 三港, 四港, 五港,) Two Harbors, Three Harbors, etc.

The distinction between *gai* and *shō* is not entirely clear. Size is not the criterion, apparently, although in the main, *gai* are larger than *shō*. It is possible for a composite *shō* to be more populous than a composite *gai*. For instance, *Hokuon-sho*, *Daiton-gun*, has a population of 20,616 while *Gosei-gai*, *Taikō-gun*, has only 13,488. It is also possible for a single village within the composite *shō* to be more populous than the principal town (*gai*) within the composite *gai*, i.e., *Muho*, *Muho-sho*, *Daiton-gun*, 8,235; *Gosei-gai*, *Gosei-gun*, 5,404 (1935 census). There is probably a slight administrative difference between the two.

As all territory in Japan is within some municipality or other (*shi*, *machi*, *mura*), so all territory in Taiwan is included in the *shi*, *gai*, and/or *shō* (*ku* in Taito and Karenkō), aborigine territory excepted. Aborigine territory is divided into police jurisdictions within the provinces.

ku (區) *Ku* is the term formerly used in Taito and Karenkō provinces (districts) to designate the subdivision known elsewhere in Taiwan as the *shō*. Although the same ideograph is used, the term *ku* does not refer to a division of a city as it does in Japan, there being no such division (ward) in Taiwan cities.

chō (町) The *chō* is an administrative division of a city, usually composed of several blocks. The ideograph is sometimes read *machi*. There are no *chō* at all in Heitō and Shōka cities, nor are all the other cities completely divided into *chō*. In some cities, as Takao and Taihoku, there are in addition to *chō* other divisions whose nature is not yet clear. They are probably suburban towns or villages.

chōme (丁目) A division of a *chō*. *Chō* are not subdivided into *chōme* in all the cities in which *chō* exist.

sha (社) Aborigine village.

2. STRUCTURE AND FUNCTIONS OF THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT-GENERAL.

(See Fig. 3, page 5.)

a. *Representation in Tōkyō Diet.* The government and people of Taiwan—Japanese as well as Formosan-Chinese—have no direct representation in the Diet at Tōkyō, except when a special envoy is sent to defend the budget or answer questions.

b. *The Governor-Generalship.* The Governor-General wields autocratic power. If he is a general or an admiral he is concurrently Commander-in-Chief of the Japanese forces stationed on the island. He promotes and dismisses officials in all branches of civil administration, being called upon to consult the Central Government at Tōkyō only in regard to appointments in certain ranks. He may suspend or cancel the orders and instructions of provincial governors and can impose, without recourse to courts of law, certain fines and terms of imprisonment not exceeding one year. It is presumed that under war-time emergency acts his powers have been increased drastically.

The Governor-General nominates provincial governors for imperial appointment, appoints city, town and village heads throughout the island and appoints one-half the membership of the provincial assemblies. He is empowered to veto acts of provincial, city and town assemblies and to dissolve assemblies at will. (See Figure 3, Relation of Local Government to the Government-General, p. 5.)

c. *The Governor's Policy.* The present Governor-General (1944) is Admiral Kiyoshi Hasegawa. Upon assuming office on 27 November 1940 the Admiral made a formal statement emphasizing Taiwan's importance as a base for the southward advance of Japanese interests. He emphasized, too, the political and strategic necessity of furthering the assimilation of the people of Taiwan, promising to make them a "second Kagoshima or a second Okinawa," i.e., to convert a once hostile and alien group to loyalty and willingness to support the central government. The official news organs of the Government-General likewise stressed the Japanization of the Formosan people, the industrialization of the island, and the implementation of the southward advance policy as guiding principles.

d. *The Director-General or Civil Administrator.* When Hasegawa became Governor, Itsuki Saito became Director-General or Civil Administrator, succeeding Jiro Morioka. The duties of the Civil Administrator, a civilian, include supervision of the Governor's secretariat and the several bureaus not within the secretariat.

e. *The Council.* An advisory council is said to reflect popular opinion for the Governor-General. In fact, it is a bureaucratic appendage of little actual importance. There are forty members, appointed by the Governor-General from other government-general officials, both civil and military, and from private persons whom the Governor chooses to honor, or thinks it politic to associate with his administration. Since all high officials are Japanese, in office because of the Governor's appointment, their voice can hardly be said to represent "popular opinion." The private persons include eminent Japanese scholars such as the president of the

Taihoku Imperial University and prominent directors of Japanese business interests, together with certain eligible wealthy Formosan-Chinese. These Chinese are of two kinds: the majority are men who found it to their economic interest to work with the Japanese early in the course of occupation (some rose from extreme poverty and obscurity because of services rendered to the invaders). Others actually represent Formosan families long prominent in pre-Japanese administration, usually large property holders whose economic position cannot be ignored. Some few are, in addition, of such social prestige among their own people that the Japanese find it useful to have them associated with the government. The position is purely honorary. Each appointment is for a two-year period, although the Governor can release appointees after a shorter period if he sees fit. The Governor-General acts as chairman and the Director-General acts as vice-chairman.

f. *Official Ranks.* Officialdom in the Japanese empire is classified by three types of appointment. The highest classification is that of *chokunin*, including the men (theoretically) appointed directly by the Emperor. Men in the second class, the *sonin*, are appointed with imperial approval. The third class of officials, the *hannin*, includes men for whose appointment the Emperor's approval is not necessary. A great deal of social prestige and political power is inherent in these ranks. The importance of an office in Japanese eyes may be determined by the rank of the man appointed to it. In the Government-General of Taiwan in 1938 there were seven men of *chokunin* rank, 119 of *sonin* rank and 648 of *hannin* rank. In the provinces and districts there were five men holding *chokunin* rank (presumably governors of the five provinces), 94 of *sonin* rank and 1,523 of *hannin* rank.

g. *Formosan-Chinese in the Government.* Few Formosan-Chinese occupy administrative positions of any sort, and the few who do are in positions which can have no direct influence upon policy or public safety. The majority of Formosan-Chinese in the government are employed as clerical translators or interpreters.

h. *Recent Administrative Changes.* Broadcasts of October 19, 1943, announced that the Taiwan Government-General would henceforth consist of the Bureaus of Police Affairs, Home Affairs, Transportation and Communications, Army, Agriculture and Commerce, and the two Departments of Juridical Affairs and Financial Affairs. A new Bureau of Maritime Affairs was also to be established. The Monopoly Bureau appears to continue as a semi-independent agency. The Bureau of Education was not mentioned.

There is evidence that the control which had been briefly assigned to the Ministries in Tōkyō was returned to Taiwan, to be vested in the Governor-General's Secretariat, thus strengthening the totalitarian and dictatorial control exercised on the island.

The secretariat of the Governor-General now appears to control Police Affairs, Financial Affairs, Judicial Affairs, the new Commerce and Industry Bureau, the new Communications Bureau and the new Maritime Affairs Bureau, Agricultural Affairs and Education. Other functions of Government may have been centered in the secretariat. The change probably is one of overall direction rather than of

individual office reorganization on the lower functional levels.

In announcing these changes in jurisdiction of the Secretariat (19 October 1943) it was further announced that "The administrative affairs of the Government-General shall be transferred to the local administrative offices." While this announcement has not been elaborated upon, it is consistent with the decentralization being carried out in Japan Proper, presumably in anticipation of direct attack upon administrative centers. An organization is being worked out whereby local (provincial) governments may continue to function effectively even if the capital city (i.e., Taihoku) is destroyed. For use in emergencies certain authority is delegated to local governments and prearrangements made to assume the functions usually exercised by the central agency of government.

3. PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT IN TAIWAN.

a. *Administrative Districts.* The administrative units, their areas and their population figures as of December, 1939, were as follows:

b. *The Governorships.* The Governor of a province (*shū*) is an imperial appointee, actually nominated by the Governor-General. The Governor of a province appoints one-half the members of city, town and village assemblies within his jurisdiction. He has full power to veto acts of the assemblies.

The Governor of a district (*cho*) is of *sonin* rank, i.e., he is nominated by the Governor-General, appointed by the Tōkyō Government (probably in the present Greater East Asia Ministry) and approved by the Emperor. The government of a district functions as the government of other provinces with the important exception that the District Assembly has no budgetary power and may advise only.

The Governor of a province or district may impose fines (not greater than seventy yen) and prison terms (not greater than two months) without recourse to the Courts. It is presumed that the changes announced in December, 1943, include increases in such powers throughout the Japanese administration.

c. *The Council.* Each provincial governor is assisted by a Council of eight members, which includes himself, the vice-governor of the province and six members elected by and from the Provincial Assembly. The Council acts when the Assembly is not in session.

d. *The Provincial Assemblies.* The Provincial Assembly has limited powers over the provincial budget, matters of tax collection and general finance. One-half of its members are appointed by the Governor-General. One-half are elected by the city, town and village assemblies, one-half of whose members in turn have been appointed by the Governor of the province.

e. *Functions of Provincial Government Offices.* Provincial governments consist each of a Governor's Secretariat, a Bureau of Police Affairs, Police Headquarters, Taxation Bureau, Bureau of Internal Affairs, Bureau of Education, etc. It is believed (but unconfirmed) that arrangements have been made for provincial offices to assume full responsibility for functions usually performed by the Government-General, a prearrangement pattern by which the Japanese hope to avoid demoralization and destruction of control if the capital city is demolished under attack.

f. *The Counties.* The county (called *gun* in the five provinces and *shichō* in the three districts) has no elective assembly. Each county head is appointed by the Governor-General. A local council, selected from among the prominent members of the community, assists the county head. The functions of the county administration are divided between General Affairs (such as public works administration) and Police Affairs, or law and order.

g. *City Government.* City governments are responsible directly to the government of the province in which they are situated. The mayor is appointed by the Governor-General, and has the power to veto acts of the city assembly. The mayor is assisted by a council of eight, including himself, the assistant mayor and six members elected from and by the city assembly. The council functions when the city assembly is not in session.

The city assembly has a membership ranging from twenty to forty, according to the population represented. One-half of the members are appointed by the Governor of the province and one-half are elected by the qualified electorate. The city assembly can act on the city budget, tax collection and general financial matters.

h. *Town Government.* Towns are responsible to the provincial government through the county administration. Town and village heads are appointed by the Governor-General. The chief of a town presides over a town assembly of eight to twenty members. Half of this membership is appointed by the Governor of the province and half is elected by the

local people eligible to vote. The term of membership is four years. The function of the town assembly is to submit opinions on various problems when asked to do so by higher authority.

i. *Village Administration.* Villages likewise are responsible to the provincial government through the county administration. Village heads are appointed by the Governor-General. Membership, organization, and duties in the village assembly parallel those of the town assembly.

j. *Recent Appointments.* Government appointments in recent years have reflected a growing measure of care concerning the internal situation and a desire to strengthen the Japanese hand in every way possible. In 1933 the Japanese appointees to city assemblies (which have some legislative power) numbered 88 and Formosans numbered 42. In 1939 Japanese appointees numbered 99 whereas Formosans numbered only 34. Although the percentage of Japanese in towns and villages is very small, the Japanese greatly outnumber the Formosans in councils and assemblies of cities and provinces.

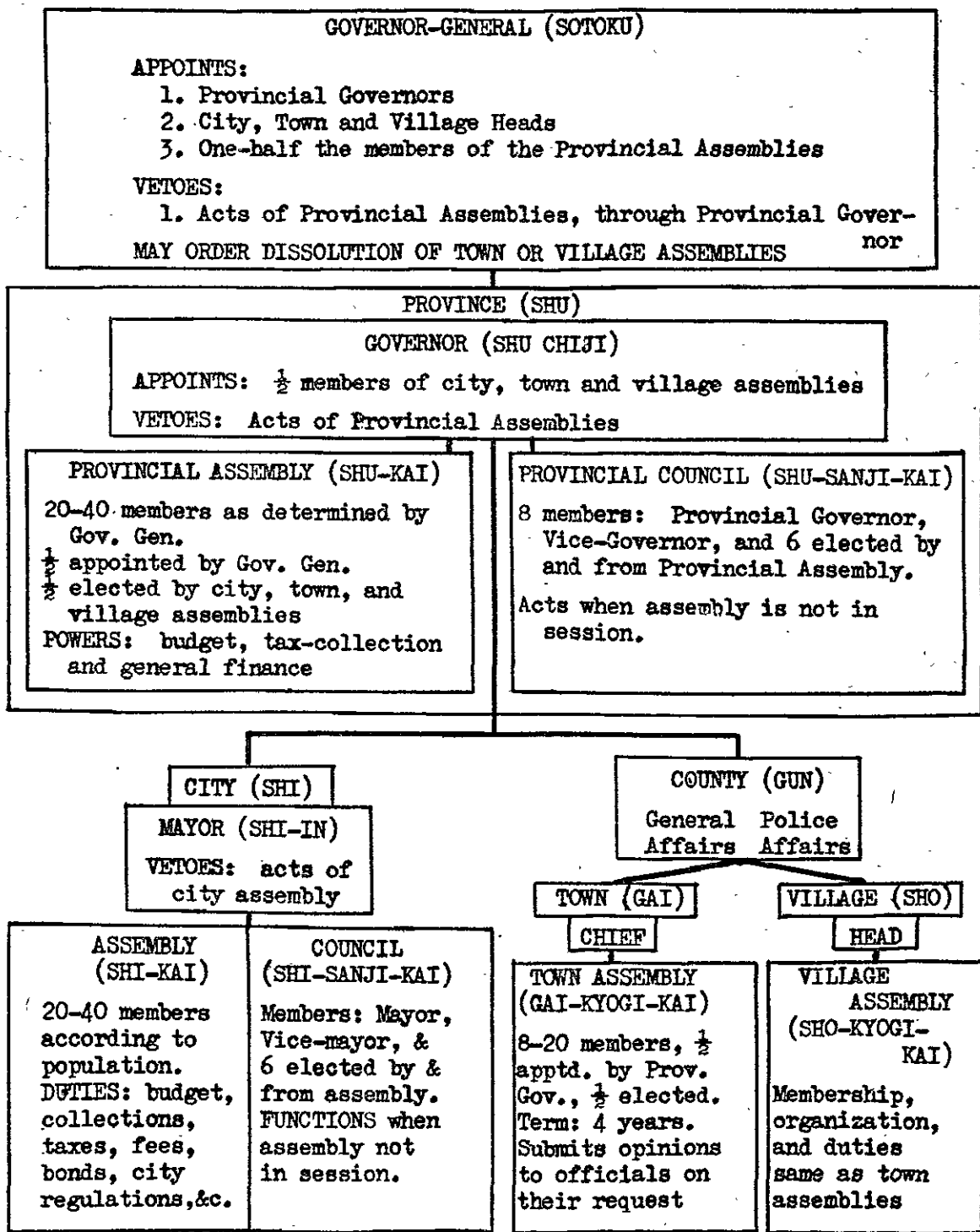


Fig. 3—Relation of Local Government to the Government-General

4. LOCAL "SELF-GOVERNMENT."

a. *Election Periods.* The present system of local self-government was established April 1, 1935, and elections for village, town, and city assemblies were held that year. The terms of local elected officials are four years. The second election in the history of Taiwan was held November 22, 1939. Of the third election, presumably held in late 1943, nothing is known.

b. *The Franchise.* The franchise in Taiwan is granted to Japanese male subjects 25 years of age or over, with independent means, resident in the city, town or village for a specified period, and who have paid a city, town, or village tax of at least five yen. Incompetents, bankrupts, and persons with prison records are ineligible to vote. (The term "Japanese male subject" does not of course exclude Formosan-Chinese; it means all subjects of the Emperor of Japan). Since the city, town or village tax is less than five yen per year for most Formosan-Chinese landholders, the number of eligible voters is greatly limited.

c. *Powers of assemblies.* Figure 3, Relation of Local Government to the Government-General (p. 5), indicates further limitations placed upon self-government in Taiwan. Only one-half the membership of the village, town, and city assemblies is elected by the people. Town and village assemblies are in no sense of the word legislative bodies. They exist only to give advice, when requested, on local matters. There is no obligation on the part of the town or village head to ask advice of the assembly or to follow such advice when given. Furthermore, the Governor-General may dissolve the town and village assemblies at will.

Provincial and city assemblies are empowered to enact a decree of the Governor-General. Both the governor of a province and the mayor of a city hold the veto power over acts of the assemblies, which power may be exercised independently or upon instruction of the Governor-General.

It is noted that in addition to the veto power, the fact that

one-half the members of provincial, city and village assemblies are appointed either by the Governor-General or the provincial governor, means that the degree of self-government available to the Formosan population is very small indeed.

The issues brought before the electorate are wholly artificial, having to do with the rivalries of local candidates and the "attitudes" they will adopt in the assemblies. There are no real "issues," for all matters allowed to come up for discussion have been selected carefully and approved by Japanese officialdom.

d. *Recent Composition of Assemblies.* The following roster of provincial and city assemblies indicates the preponderant position in government held by Japanese:

It is notable that in one instance, Shōka City, Formosans outnumbered Japanese, 16 to 10, and also that in Takao, Taiwan's most important military port, the proportion of Japanese to Formosans on the city assembly was 19 to 7.

e. *The Election of November 22, 1939.* The second election since the founding of Japanese administration in Taiwan was held November 22, 1939. Government appointees to the city, town and village assemblies were announced November 10, and from that date until the election, vigorous campaigns were carried on by the candidates for people's representatives. Meetings were held in all parts of the island and much publicity matter was distributed. It is estimated that a campaign for membership in a city assembly, such as that of Taihoku, cost each candidate approximately ¥3,000.

Results of the election and the relative numbers of Japanese and Formosan-Chinese assembly members are indicated in the following tables:

It should be noted that in the city assemblies, Japanese outnumbered Formosan-Chinese by 51, as compared with 42 at the time of the previous election. In town and village assemblies, the percentage of Japanese members is small.

f. *The Electorate.* The large increase in qualified voters over the previous election of 1935 is shown by the following figures:

Voters were urged to exercise their right of suffrage, and the percentage of those qualified who actually voted was 96.73 percent. The best record was attained by Shinchiku province, 99 percent of whose qualified voters turned out at the election. It may be a significant coincidence that the Hakka people form a high percentage of the population here. The lowest local percentage was in Keelung city (89 percent).

The number of spoiled ballots showed an increase over the record of four years previous, due to the fact that voters were required to write personally the name of the candidate for whom they cast their vote. Special instruction in writing *kana* (Japanese syllabary) was offered in many towns and villages previous to the election. The fact that the instructors thereby had fore-knowledge of a voter's choice was not discussed publicly.

It is natural that, because of the distribution of population, the number of Formosan-Chinese representatives-elect should be greater in towns and villages than in cities. It is also interesting to note the comparatively small number of Formosan-Chinese among the government appointees of city assemblies. Appointees to the nine city assemblies showed an increase from 88 to 99 Japanese and a decrease from 42 to 34 Formosans in office.

The fact that 96.73 percent of all qualified voters took advantage of the franchise contradicts the claim made by many Japanese (and foreign) writers, that the Formosan-Chinese is politically indifferent or lethargic.

5. THE REGISTER OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS. Year after year the Japanese publish a register of officialdom (*Shokuin-roku*), arranged in the first instance according to the branch of government in which the individuals serve and (within that section of government) according to their official rank. The volume here translated is the 1939 edition. Later issues are available, but they have been drastically reduced in volume, and record only the names of those officials in the upper brackets.

Such a registry as this represents only half of the machinery of government in Taiwan. For civil affairs interests it is perhaps the lesser half in point of actual importance. There is here recorded only that part of the government which has been created by Japanese law and decree and superimposed upon local indigenous organizations developed by the Formosan-Chinese themselves (in many instances long before the Japanese took the island) or by local Japanese through a practical process of meeting local problems. The two levels upon which life is organized in Taiwan are only loosely related in legal fact.

6. SUPERIOR LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT. The Japanese hierarchy reaches down from the Imperial Government at Tokyo through the Government-General at Taihoku and the provincial governments to the level of *gun* or "county" administration. Policies are formed and initiative taken to issue directives. These are the levels for which yearly budgets are known, and their powers and activities well defined.

In the following paragraphs there is an attempt to describe some of the features of local government and its impingement upon indigenous organizations. In October 1941 a local official in Taiwan, a man of considerable insight, published a criticism of the confusion which was resulting from the ambiguous relationship between the lowest formal government agencies and the informal or quasi-public organizations created locally to meet local problems. The quotations which follow are from that article. Couched though it was in the circumlocutions necessary in an attack upon the shortcomings of the government in Japan, it reflects a serious fear that these informal relations might not be able to meet the

strain put upon them by enormously increased war demands.

The greatest increase in local business appears to have taken place in the application of new measures of controlled economy (*Tōsei Keizai*), the regulations of which fall into three classes, prohibitions, prescribed regulations, and agreements or pacts, all of which require complicated clerical work.

7. LOCAL LEVELS OF FORMAL GOVERNMENT. The administrative office of the *gun* (the *Gunyakusho*) is the lowest of all government offices. There is no consistent and sufficient grant from the larger budgets to support it.

"... it is a fact that the *gun* administration in the first line [of local war effort] has the responsibility of seeing to it that the administrative policies of the country or the province are diffused with thoroughness. Accordingly there are not many policies or plans of their own."

That is to say, from the legal point of view, as the *gun* offices were constituted in October 1944, they existed merely to carry out the national and provincial policies at the local level. The *gun* administration officers who are appointed by the government and who represent the central (island) administration—the *Sōtoku-fu*—include representatives of the Police Affairs section (*Keisatsu-ka*), General Affairs (*Shōmu-ka*), school inspectors and assistants, and assistant engineers. All are below the sixth grade of official rank and most of them receive salaries as low as ¥40 per month. The *gunshi*, or chief, may receive a salary of as much as ¥100 per month "more or less." Such salaries are not commensurate with the weight of the duties expected to be performed. As a consequence those Japanese who accept appointment are not of the highest quality as administrators. In some few instances Formosan-Chinese are given "honorary appointments" bearing no income. "Moreover, all the officials are burdened with changing laws due to economic changes, numerous notices and instructions from the higher governmental officers. They scarcely have time to digest the contents of the documents. I doubt if they can execute the policies to perfection in the spirit of the laws as they are intended."

Even though the burden of duties was steadily increasing, as late as 1941 little had been done to improve the lot of the official in the *gun* level of government and below. Mutual aid measures, allowances for families and emergency allowances had been established for officials in the higher brackets, but the men below the sixth grade of rank were yet to receive the real support and encouragement needed from the higher echelons of government.

Insofar as the Government-General was concerned, it appears that the *gun* offices were looked upon merely as instruments to carry out the will of the higher authorities and policy makers. Little initiative was expected of them, and little done to give them effective support through funds for public expenditure or reward for individual service.

In more extreme cases, the chief of the *gun* sometimes abuses the police power which he possesses, in order to achieve the things he has been ordered to do and which he believes must be done.

8. INFORMAL GOVERNMENT THROUGH OCCUPATIONAL ASSOCIATIONS. Administration on the local community level is actually effected by numerous associations—livestock associations, irrigation associations, etc.—and through the “village associations” (*buraku-kai*), all of which are sponsored by Japanese officials. These have been established with the *gun* officials taking leadership, but they are unofficial in fact. Although the government at higher levels expects many things of them and names them constantly, they have no explicit basis in law.

“Of course, the works carried out by these organizations and associations are not the functions of the government officials as such, but actually are done by them in the dual capacity of private individual and *gun* official, but on the surface and in effect they appear to be the proper works of the *gun* office.”

9. VILLAGE ASSOCIATIONS. The *Buraku-kai*, or village associations, are patterned after Japanese homeland rural assemblies. In Taiwan they have been promoted by the Japanese and in fact transact public business though they are legally private or non-official organizations without official funds. No allotments accompany the official orders which emanate from higher authority with mandatory effect. It is exactly at this point in Japanese administrative organization that the cost of government in such a large measure is shifted directly to the people and does not appear in official budgets or accounting. To its own advantage Japanese officialdom maintains that these organizations are merely “voluntary” meetings of the residents of a locality, and that they have no public character, and that therefore there is no obligation on the part of the central government to arrange for or to provide their finances. If there are any expenses to be met—and there usually are—it is up to the residents to meet them. Specific instances include such activities as the maintenance of local roads, the building of shrines, the repair of bridges, and the clearing of airfields. Sometimes partial subsidies or grants-in-aid are made where the undertaking is of such magnitude to make local effort wholly insufficient.

10. THE *hokō* (*pa-chieh*) SYSTEM OF ORGANIZED HOUSEHOLD GROUPS. Before the Japanese took over the island the principal community organization was a traditional association of households. The eldest in every household (or a deputy appointed by him or selected by the family) met together with the eldest representatives of neighboring houses, usually in groups of about ten. Problems of mutual interest were discussed and cooperative action taken on many aspects of community life, including the selection of spokesmen responsible to the local Chinese government representatives, communal work in irrigation, road maintenance, tax collection, and many other functions not undertaken directly by the provincial government. During the invasion and military campaign of occupation these same groups often supported guerrilla activities, and made possible the prolonged resistance of the unarmed, ill-equipped, disorganized Formosan army.

During the long period of serious unrest which followed, the Japanese discovered the strength and potential usefulness of the system and adapted it to their own needs. Membership in the mutual responsibility groups is obligatory for the

Chinese, and optional for the Japanese, but any failures to be cooperative in either group come immediately to the attention of the police.

The *hokō* system was given legal status by decree of the Taiwan Government-General in 1898 as a subsidiary organization to assist police administration. In 1909 its duties were widened to include assistance to local civil administration.

One *kō* is a group of approximately ten households. A *ho* is ten *kō*, or approximately 100 households. The head of each *kō* is elected by the householders, but this choice must be approved by the head of the county (*gun*) and the respective heads of district and local police stations. Election of the head of the *ho*, the *hosei*, is subject to the approval not only of county and police officials but also of the provincial or district governor. The term of office is two years, and the occupants may be re-elected.

Although the *ho* is usually composed of ten *kō*, the organization is quite elastic and varies according to locality. In designating the extent of a *ho*, attention is exercised in order that local unity may be preserved as far as possible. A city, town or village may be made up of one or several *ho*. In organizing a *hokō* unit, an agreement must be drawn up bearing the joint signatures of the household heads concerned. The approval of the governor of the province or district must then be secured and registration with the police offices completed.

Japanese, Koreans and other foreigners are not required to become members of the *ho* or the *kō*.

The duties of the heads of the *ho* and *kō* are defined as follows:

- (1) Maintenance of peace and order in the district.
- (2) Taking local census.
- (3) Encouragement of good morals and conduct, punishment of offenders (morals and conduct).

The law provides that rewards and punishment may be meted out by the heads of *ho* and *kō* as incentives to the maintenance of order and welfare. The chiefs of the various *ho* organize associations which may meet for discussion of local problems.

Expenses for the *hokō* are obtained from levies on the households amounting to an average of 60 sen per month per household. Thus the Japanese government in Taiwan frees itself of a large administrative expense.

In practice, although the *hokō* system is Chinese in origin and existed in Taiwan long before the Japanese occupation, it is utilized as a means to Japanize the Formosan population. In the past the chief of the *ho* was by tradition the patriarch of the village, and these offices were held almost without exception by old men. At present, knowledge of the Japanese language is being made a requisite for the position of chief. This has resulted in a complete change in personnel, with leadership almost invariably resting in the hands of young men whose education has been Japanese.

Close police supervision of the *hokō* system means that the thought and activities of every household can be easily controlled. Meetings in towns and villages for anti-foreign exhortation are quickly and efficiently created by means of the *hokō* system.

It is this system which facilitates contributions and levies for special purposes. Such requisitions often take the form

11. THE OFFICIAL "GO-BETWEEN" OR AGENT. The *sewa-yaku* or "go-between" is one of the most important figures in local administration in Taiwan. When the Japanese first invaded the island they were faced with an acute language problem, having few officials who could speak both Japanese and Formosan-Chinese dialects. To meet this difficulty (as well as the difficulty of dealing with many unfamiliar customs and standards) there developed the practice of selecting one or more prominent or responsible men in the community to act as "go-betweens" in receiving Japanese orders and conveying them, with explanations, to the general public. At present this official "go-between" or agent is often at the same time the head of the local *ho* or *kō* organization, a Formosan-Chinese prominent among his own people.

Relations between Japanese officialdom on the lowest levels and the local population are not uniform throughout the island. Some communities are fortunate in having Japanese administrators who are earnest in their effort to improve and develop local social and economic conditions and who are honest in their belief that the Formosan-Chinese can be assimilated to the Japanese empire in spirit as well as in political and economic regulation. The character and community spirit of the local Formosan-Chinese leaders also can affect official relations with the public. In some districts the Japanese rely upon police power or the threat of it, and Formosan-Chinese of real integrity do not offer their services. In such a situation the heads of the *ho* and the *kō* and of other officially sponsored organizations are either local people performing their duties under coercion (under threat of economic or corporal reprisals) or persons whose willingness to collaborate with the Japanese has made them objectionable to their own people.

Whereas the official *gun* offices, the associations and the village associations (*buraku-kai*) are sponsored or staffed by the Japanese, the *hokō* organization is an indigenous cooperative Taiwanese community arrangement.

12. THE IMPINGEMENT OF JAPANESE ORGANIZATION UPON LOCAL COMMUNITIES. The *hokō* organizations and the *buraku* (village) organizations exist in the same communities, but the areas which they cover are not necessarily coincident. That is to say, by virtue of their geographic distribution, members of a given *hokō* organization may be at the same time members of different village associations or vice versa.

"The relationship between the *hokō* and the *buraku* is seen to be regulated smoothly on the surface [i.e.

as far as official pronouncements go] but if one is to delve into it deeply, it is not hard to find many complicated matters. . . . It is earnestly hoped that the authorities concerned will use their best judgment in the execution of the *buraku* system and its relationship to the *hokō* system."

In an attempt to accelerate the assimilation of the local Formosan-Chinese to the Japanese way of thinking and doing things, there has been an increased effort to use the *hokō* organization. They are now called "Imperial people's *hokō* association" (*kōmin-hokō-kai*). The Japanese authorities have increased their efforts to bind the people to the Japanese war machine and in doing so have created for themselves a much more complicated local organization.

"... In addition the spread of patriotic movements gives them occasion to meet the people intimately, making their official responsibility much heavier, and naturally the nation depends upon their higher efficiency. . . ."

"... there are many cases in the rural districts where it is almost impossible to find a man as a *sewa-yaku* ("go-between") who will become a leading spirit of the *hokō* organization."

"In most cases the head of the *kō* is named to be *sewa-yaku* but in the past not much was expected [by the Japanese] in the leadership of the *kō*."

There is evidence that the Japanese have failed to make a careful distinction between the rules and regulations (as well as the motivating purposes) of the *shigaishō* (local Japanese officialdom) representing the Government-General, and the *hokō* system, representing the basic organization of the Formosan-Chinese community. The recent "patriotic movement" within the *hokō* groups has been stimulated and directed by the police but insofar as finance and immediate purpose are concerned, it remains quite unconnected with the local and central governments, except that the officials of one are the individuals promoting and leading the other.

"They are actually entirely separate organizations in sentiment."

The elaboration of local officialdom in recent years has probably hastened the detailed organization of the *hokō* for Japanese nationalist purposes.

"... because there is a very close relationship between these two bodies it is feared that the function of these organizations may be confused and may create a conflict in sentiment. However, it is absolutely necessary to keep the functions of these two bodies [the local government and the *hokō*] distinctly separate."

The low wages and the hard work apparently have resulted in a very high turnover of local Japanese officialdom in the recent past, or at least in many applications for reassignments, for there has been comment upon the lessening of these requests as the benefits of emergency allowances, pensions, etc., began to be felt in lower brackets of administration.

In the more advanced communities—communities adjacent to cities or for the longest time under complete dominance of the Japanese authorities—the role of *sewa-yaku* or "go-be-

tween" is accepted as a matter of course and the position is taken in rotating succession by prominent members of the community. In the more remote and less tightly organized rural areas, however, the authorities appear to have greater difficulty in securing the services of local Formosan-Chinese leaders.

There is indirect evidence that resistance has been met in

the effort to shift as much administrative work as possible to the members and officers of the Village Association, other occupational associations and to the leaders of the *ho* and *ko*. A demand has risen that clerks (*shoki*) paid by the government, be appointed to each village administration to assist in the details. It is not known whether this has been accomplished by this time.

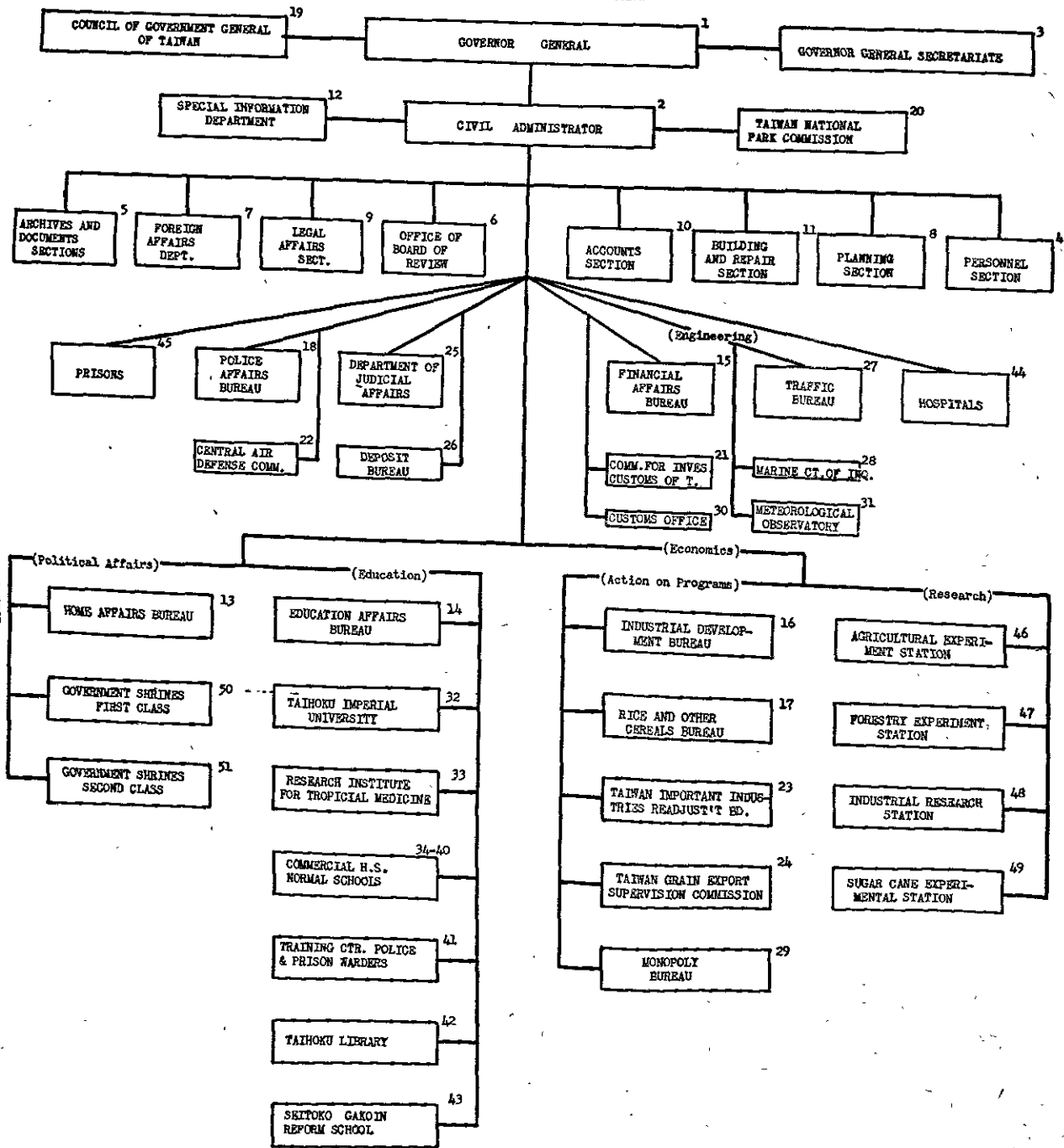


FIG. 4.—Government-General Organization

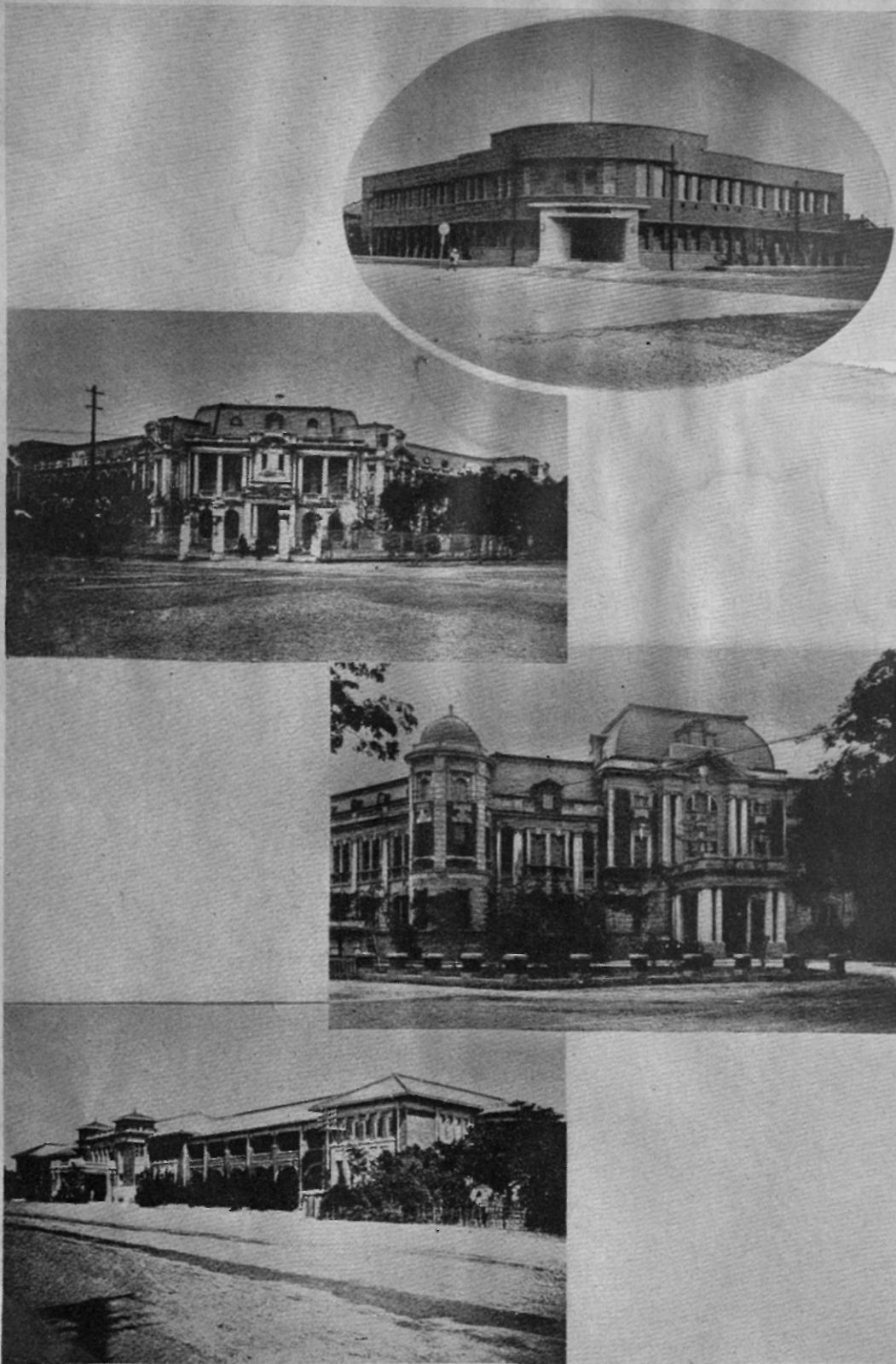

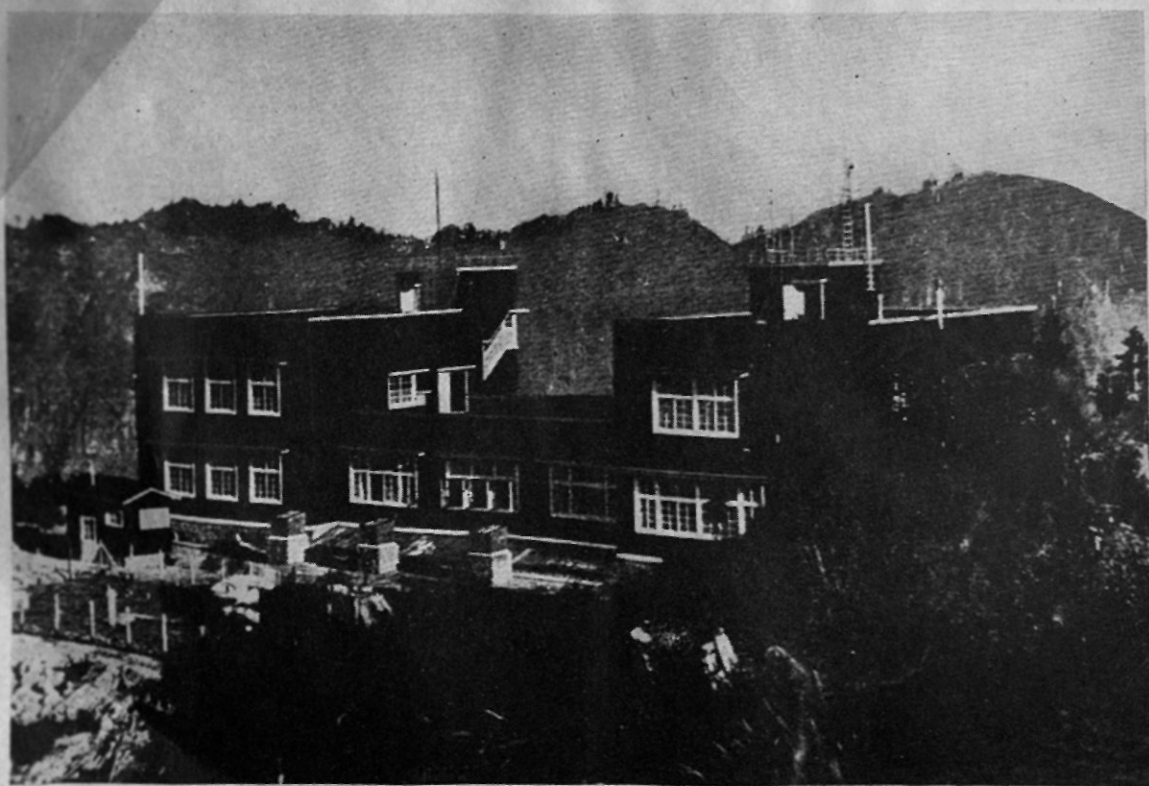

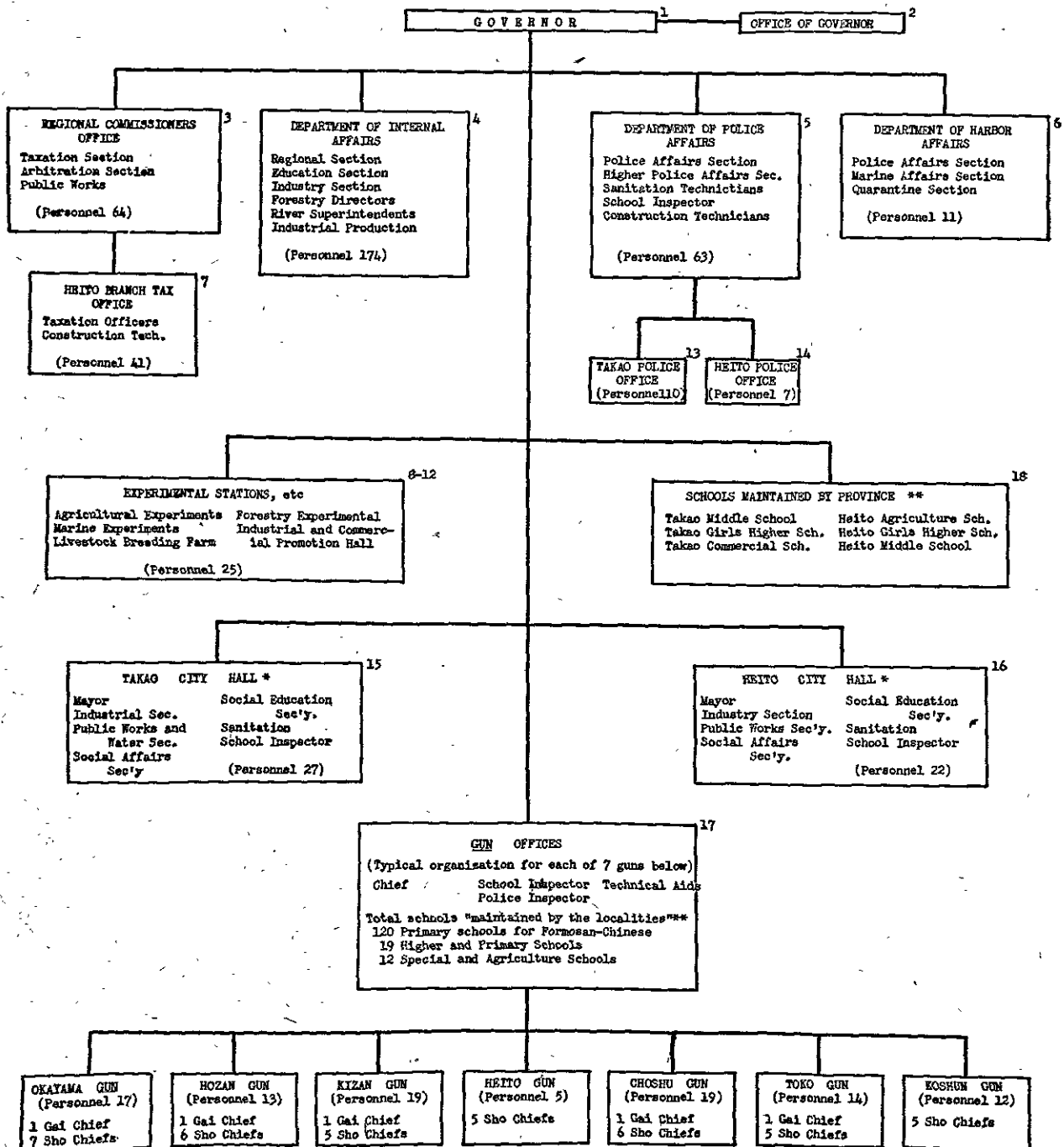
