## From the Director

I am also thrilled to announce an anonymous, and extremely generous, gift to the Conservation Center of \$500,000 for a new scanning electron microscope and for four years of funding for visiting professorship in conservation, to be called the Judith Praska Distinguished Visiting Professorship.
