Dear Dr. Avineri:

I have recently returned from a two-week study mission to Israel under the auspices of the Canadian Professors for Peace in the Middle East and the Israel Universities Study Group for Middle Eastern Affairs (Mr. Moshe Ofer, Director). I understand that the tour was made possible through the assistance of your office. I am writing to express some concerns relating to the ideological orientation of the program.

I should like to preface my remarks with the expression of my high regard for the organizational quality of the program as well as its general concept. Having been involved in Zionist causes for many years, I can state without hesitation, that the study mission concept directed at the intellectual community in North America is one of the best methods of presenting Israel's case and of generating thought and involvement on Mideastern affairs.

My basic concern in regard to the recently completed mission (May 17-May 31), is the ideological slant it acquired through the process of speaker selection, and the nature and scheduling of some of the activities. I believe that Israel's moral and ideological stance was misrepresented and damaged by the organizer serving with the Israel office of the APPME, Mrs. Hadari, a self-admitted militant secularist.

First on the matter of speaker selection. Upon the recommendation of a previous Canadian study mission (last December), a request was sent from Toronto to Mrs. Hadari that Professor Avni-Segre be scheduled as one of the speakers. The TorontoDecember group was unanimous that Professor Avni-Segre was by far the most impressive lecturer it heard. The group was particularly impressed with the brilliance of his presentation and his stress on the roots of Judaism in defence of Israel's case.

Upon arrival in Israel, I was informed by Mrs. Hadari that our group would not hear Professor Segre since, in her words, "He split the previous group." This is clearly in contradiction with the opinion of my colleagues (mostly non-Jewish) from the December mission, who were impressed with his convincing presentation of the unique historical, ideological and religious ties which link the Jewish people to its land. On the same subject, I should point out that the only speaker representing the substantial traditionally

oriented Israeli population on our mission was Knesset member, Yehuda Ben-Meir, who cannot be said to represent the mainstream of thought of that population. At the same time, Mrs. Hadari judged it important that our group hear the views of Knesset Member, Marcia Friedman. (Incidentally, in her sketch of Mr. Ben-Meir, Mrs. Hadari typically described him as "psyched-out"). Also, of the many specialists in a variety of fields our group heard, there was not one staff member of Bar-Ilan University.


I am further concerned with some other activities of the mission. Among the various "hospitality" visits and dinner table guests which were part of our schedule, there was an obvious lack of individuals representing the traditionally oriented segment of Israeli society. Moreover, the organizers disregarded the feelings of several members of our group who observed the laws of Kashrut, by scheduling some meals in non-kosher restaurants.

All in all, I believe that a disservice was done to the cause and to the image of Israel. Although I express my personal views on this matter, I should add that similar criticisms were echoed occasionally by some of my colleagues on this mission.

Although I am reluctant to recommend that you discontinue using Mrs. Hadari's services, since her organizational ability is considerable, I believe that her strong secularist bias and fundamental lack of a profound understanding of the ethos of Israel (she is relatively a new immigrant from the United States), require that her service on the program be strictly supervised and supplemented by a person more balanced in his or her views, and possessing a deeper understanding of Israeli society.

I wish to stress again that in spite of the criticism I have voiced, the concept of the study mission is excellent and in many ways the recent CPPME mission was very successful.

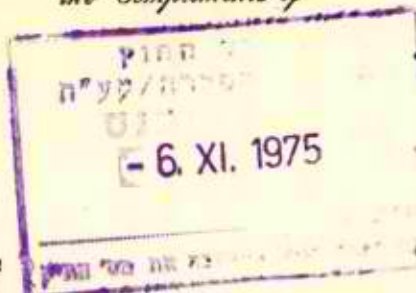

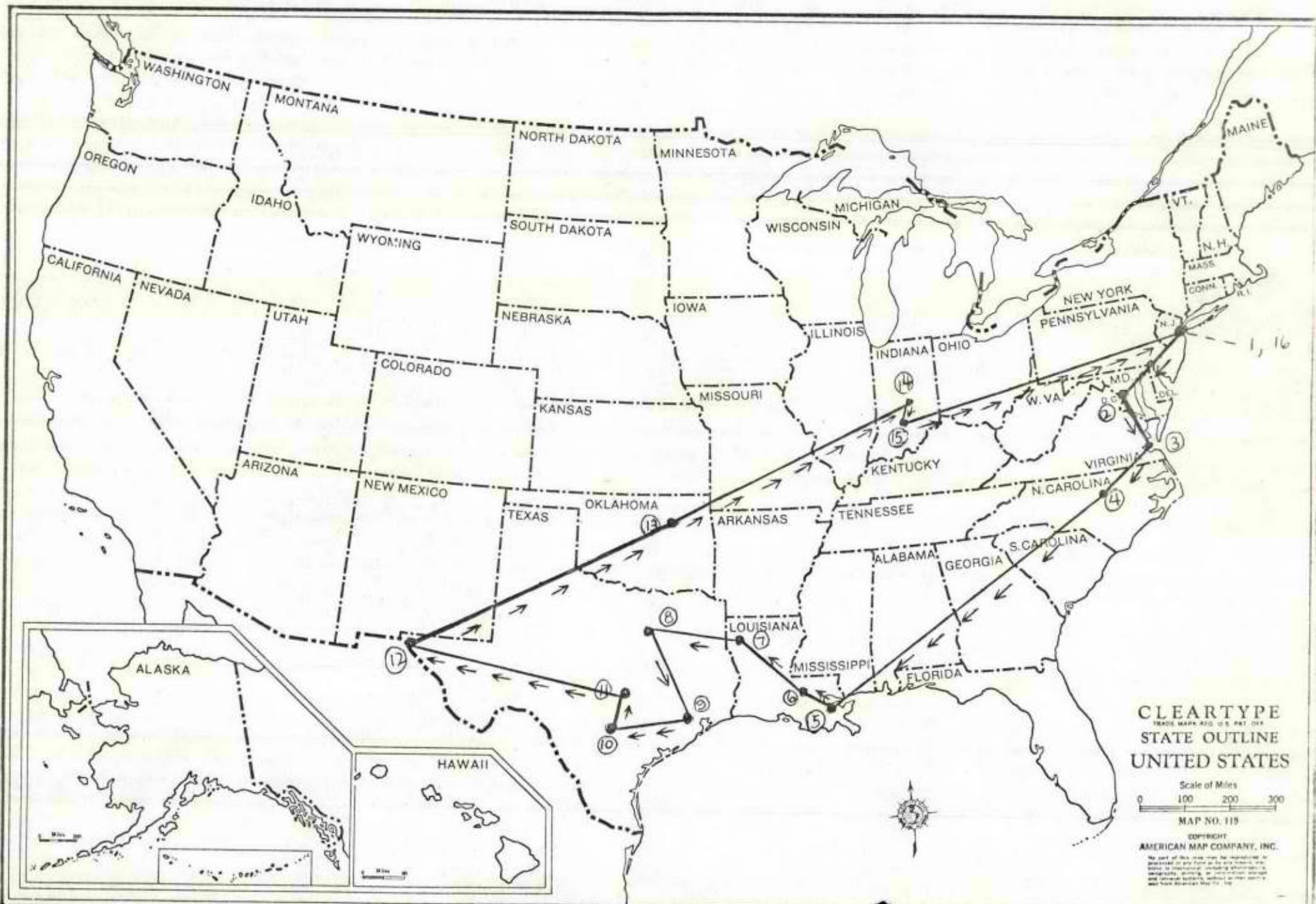
