
I am writing with congratulations on your Nobel Prize for Peace and the recent peace treaty between Israel and Jordan.

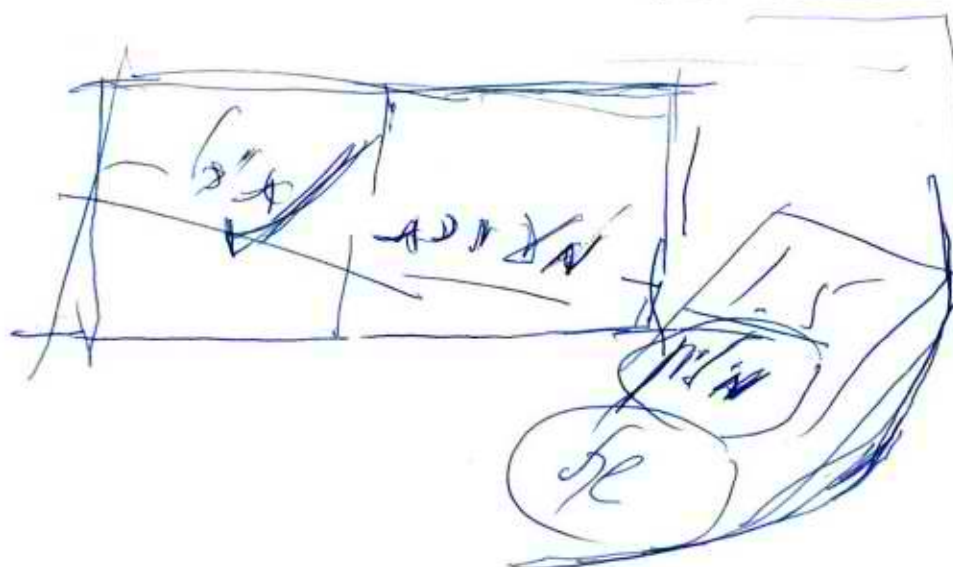
