I am sorry that my congratulations to you on your Summit meeting with King Hussein in Washington on 25 July should be tinged with sadness over the subsequent terrorist attacks in London.

I warmly welcome the Washington Declaration which ended the state of belligerency between Israel and Jordan. This is another huge step towards a comprehensive settlement in the Region. I shall be reiterating the British Government's strong support for the peace process in my speech to the Conservative Middle East Council later today. The process continues to bring hope to the region, and I hope that there will be further steady movement towards a comprehensive settlement.

I spoke to your Ambassador on the telephone yesterday evening, following his meeting with the Foreign Secretary. I assured him, as did Douglas Hurd, that we would do whatever we could to help and protect his Embassy. As you can imagine, the attacks on the Embassy and on Balfour House in Finchley have evoked feelings of outrage and sympathy throughout this country.


