The PLO-Israel 'piece' agreement

CAL THOMAS

If you were Yasser Arafat and in decline on the world stage, drained of power and influence among your own people and shunned by much of the Arab world because you supported Saddam Hussein's shelling not only of Israel but of Saudi Arabia, what would you do to save yourself? How could you continue the pursuit of a Palestinian state that could be used to eliminate the nation of Israel and its people? You would do precisely what Arafat has done — make "peace" with Israel.

It was sickening to watch members of Congress fawn over Arafat, asking for his autograph and treating him like a candidate for the Nobel peace prize. This man is responsible for the deaths of thousands of Israeli civilians, including schoolchildren.

What we are witnessing in the Middle East "peace process" is a replay of that old liberal attitude toward the Soviet Union in the 1970s. So many liberals believed that the Soviet leadership was basically good, not bad, and the problem was not in their country, but in ours. We were told on countless talk shows and by academics, clergy and pundits that our bad attitude made the Soviets "defensive" and that if we would just "give peace a chance," all would be well.

The stuff of Stephen King novels

That's why Ronald Reagan was ridiculed when he spoke of the "evil empire." A lot of liberals believe that a concept like evil is the stuff of Stephen King novels, not Realpolitik.

This mentality has surfaced again in people such as Alexander Schindler, president of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Schindler wrote a column in the *New York Times* criticizing those in Israel and America who distrust Arafat.

Schindler wrote that people who are suspicious of the PLO-Israel agreement suffer from "ideological rigor mortis" and that they "see peace as the weak sister of victory, not the bride of confidence." In fact, they see this as an arranged marriage that is far less likely to succeed than one in which the parties choose each other with the best motives.

Which Arafat is to be believed — the one who says he will do all he can to control the unruly terrorist groups such as Hamas, who have denounced the agreement and vowed to fight on, or the one who says "the Palestinian state is at hand and the Palestinian flag will soon fly over Jerusalem"?

When the stray cat is fed, it comes back for more.

What we are witnessing is a replay of that old liberal attitude toward the Soviet Union in the 1970s.

Those who believe the PLO will be satisfied with even full autonomy in Jericho and Gaza are doubly deceived. They have been deceived by Arafat and they have deceived themselves.

Likud Party leader Benjamin Netanyahu has rightly raised the analogy of Hitler and Neville Chamberlain, who thought he could buy "peace in our time" by sacrificing Czechoslovakia in an earlier "land-for-peace" deal. On his deathbed, Chamberlain said, "Everything would have been all right if Hitler hadn't lied to me."

This is the inevitable result when we forget that evil exists and that some people in the world are evil and cannot be dissuaded by high-sounding words and virtuous intentions.

Would have made peace years ago

There are many good Palestinians who would have made genuine peace with Israel years ago, but they were assassinated by those who now wrap themselves in the robe of statesmen in order to hide the blood on their clothes.

It does not take a prophetic gift to predict, sadly, what will happen next. There may be a season of what appears to be peace, but plotters and conspirators will be working to achieve their religious and political goal of eradicating the "Zionist infidels" and reclaiming the land for Allah.

I wish it weren't true, but this pact between Israel and Arafat is a "piece" agreement. It will allow Arafat to achieve, piece by piece, what he could not get all at once in five wars and numerous terrorist acts. This agreement will inevitably lead to another war.

Will the United States condemn those who make war against Israel in the future? Not if the recent past is any guide. Most likely Israel will hear those familiar calls for "restraint" when the rockets start falling on Tel Aviv or perhaps Jerusalem, as Israel's historical enemies fight on until their objective is achieved.

Good intentions may soothe our consciences in the short term, but they are not enough. Remember, good intentions are the paving material on the road to hell.

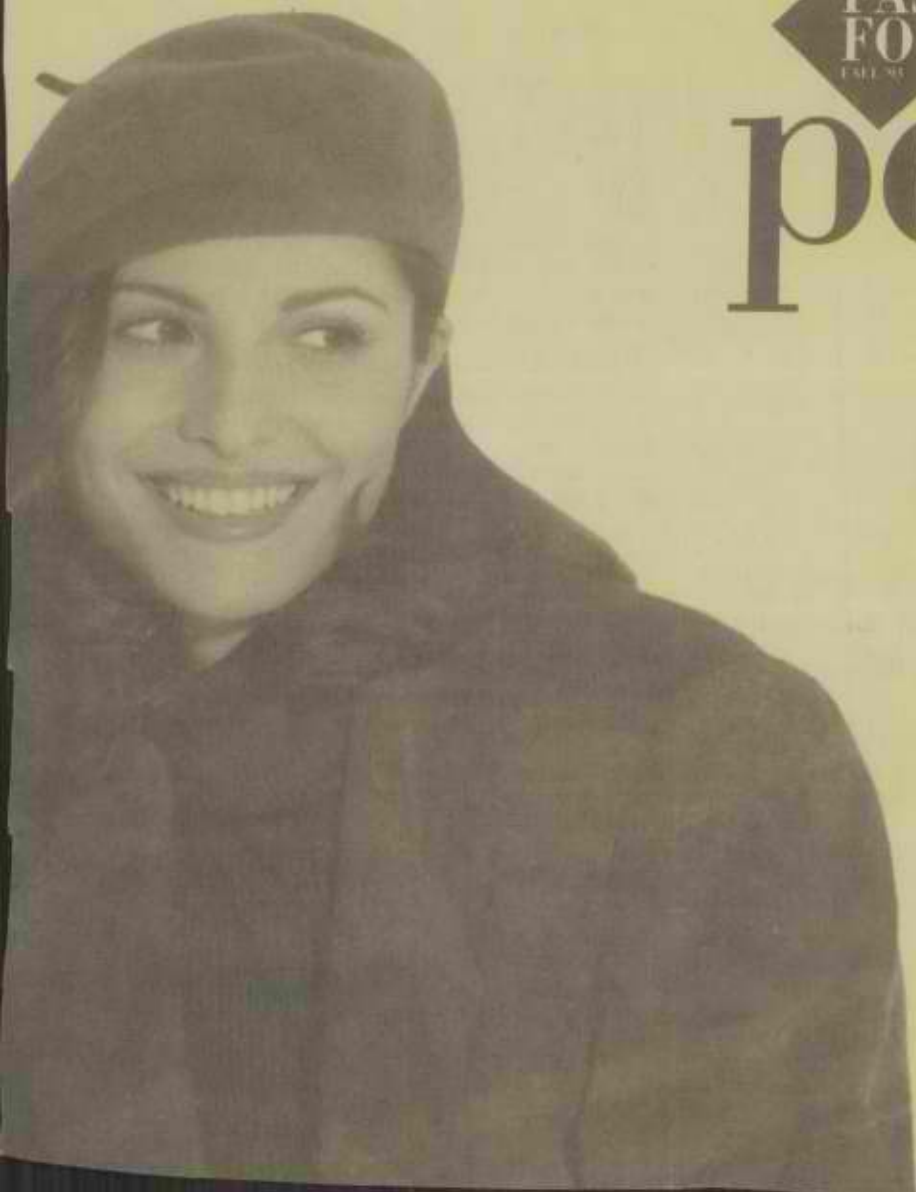
Both studies involved paramedics who were in radio contact with doctors and were equipped to provide defibrillation, open a blocked airway and provide medication to cardiac arrest victims.

Kellermann and researchers at the University of Tennessee in Memphis studied 1,068 people who suffered cardiac arrest from 1988 to 1992 and were treated by the Memphis Fire Department. Of

damage.

In the second study, a team led by Dr. Marni Bonnin in Houston found that of 952 people who suffered cardiac arrest and had no pulse when they reached the hospital, six survived until discharge.

The costs, both studies said, are huge. Transporting and trying to revive these patients costs \$500 million a year, Bonnin's study estimated.

Dear Prime Minister Rabin,

I am writing today to thank you -- and Mr. Peres -- from the bottom of my heart for bringing about a colossal feat, and for overseeing the birth of an era of peace during your watch over Israel. Mazeltov, General, for taking this extraordinary step during my lifetime.

Some years ago, it would have been an act of treason to even remotely conceive that I would be addressing a letter of thanks to the Israeli Prime Minister, let alone to one of my enemy's foremost generals. But, here I am! Life is truly unpredictable!

Now you might be wondering what exactly am I thanking you for? Let me tell you.

I am an American woman. I was born in Jerusalem, Palestine in 1943. Yes, exactly fifty years ago. Five decades. Half a century. A painful, insecure, angry lifetime ago. And, let me level with you, I hated Israel and all the Jewish people throughout forty of those years. Really, hated. I felt victimized and abused. My birthright, my nationality, my heritage, I felt, had been brutally desecrated. And I wallowed in self-pity and rage.

Briefly, in 1983, after the horrible massacres at Sabra and Shatila -- a place with which I was very familiar, and whose people I had known -- I took up my pen and addressed a Jewish woman. Leah. I asked her how much more it was going to take before we came to our senses. That letter shattered an invisible wall within my soul. It shred to smithereens the sinews of hatred seeping through my veins and cells. Its genuine emotion starkly staring at me demanded a follow-up. Begged for realization. I, who hadn't uttered a prayer since the start of the civil war in Lebanon, found myself praying for peace. And He heard me. He must have! For, the opportunity to realize my wish and to translate my yearning to dialogue with the imaginary Leah came knocking at my door. I had the privilege of meeting a Leah -- many Leahs! -- through The Dialogue Project which brought American Palestinian and American Jewish women together in an unprecedented forum.

Oh, General Rabin! We dialogued and argued. We pouted and postured. In one instance we were genuine and in another we were so pretentious! One minute we shed tears, the other we were as catty as we women can sometimes be! By the end of 1990, I had resolved the dilemma between the Israelis and Palestinians -- in my own heart and mind. I knew then, very clearly and unequivocally, that peace will happen. That it was possible. That taboos and

barriers had fallen away. The psychological dam had battered itself through! It took two years -- and the Madrid Peace Conference -- for me to process that conviction and to smile as I heard the news filtering out of Norway that a magnificent breakthrough had, indeed, happened. I wasn't surprised. After all, I knew that it would happen. But I was, nevertheless, elated!

Now, having gone through fifty years of bloodshed and trauma, I have my birthright once again. I can confidently say: I am of Palestinian origin. No one will say: What? Where? Who? It is a tremendous feeling!

Now, I can reconnect with my heritage and, one day, point to a map and tell my grandchildren, "this is the country where I was born." And my precocious American grandchild will not say to me: "But I thought you said that you were a Palestinian. How come you're pointing at Israel?" Also, I can recount how, in my own small way, I was one of the cornerstones on which the peace was built, and that I helped to painstakingly lay the foundations for it. How proud I will be! How starry-eyed they would be, those angelic grandchildren, as they look at me -- an instrument of peace -- in awe.

Now, rather than being so pathetically self-conscious when trying to explain the oh-so-complicated issue of Palestine, I can exult in my experience and proudly manifest how I went from belligerent enmity to peaceful coexistence.

Now, rather than rage, I can exhibit reason. With confidence and pride. And I can rise above all warriors and patronizingly tell them that their sworn enemies of today will be their friends tomorrow. I can assertively promise them that no war lasts forever.

Now, I can die in peace. For this issue was an unfinished business in my life. A very, very unfinished business that would have nagged me all the way to Heaven. (Where all Palestinians and all Jews are going for we've all served our time in Hell. Yes, we have.)

Now, I can confidently and proudly link hands with my American Jewish sisters and brothers and march into America's angry neighborhoods and enraged enclaves touting peace and understanding, strewn the hate-ridden streets and drug-infested alleys with our message of tolerance and justice. Now, I have earned the right to do that. With authority. With the weight of a bloody experience on my back and the traces of grief-ridden tears still apparent on my cheeks.

The pundits and the analysts are dissecting your motives. They seem so full of themselves as they inflate the air-waves and printed pages with their hypothesis and cynicism. They don't seem to know what I do, though: That it takes a mature sage who has been through the ravages of the Holocaust and survived those; who

has gone through the past fifty years traumatized by this monumental tragedy; who underwent his own rage and battles with this trauma to know how worthwhile peace is. It takes a man of resolute conviction to put an end to the bloodbath that was shrivelling the soul of the Jewish people, and that of the Palestinian people, as they persisted in perpetuating Hitler's legacy on their ancient land, in full view of their prophet's saddened eyes. In the final analysis, all it took was the courage of the brave and the wisdom of the pained. All other reasons are peripheral. Isn't that so?

The road before us is mired, as you very well know. But I am one of many Palestinians who will support your fortitude and soldier on with you as we valiantly walk towards a tomorrow that we thought would never come.

Thank you, General Rabin. You will go down in history as one of the greatest men of this century. And, in my books, you will always be the man who restored my faith in humanity.

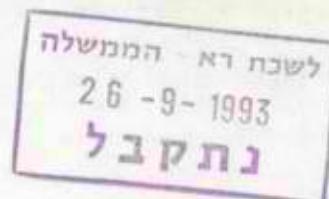

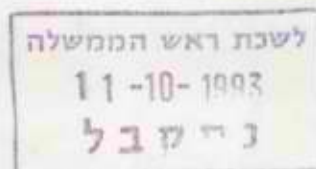

Religion und Macht

Religionen wurden der Menschheit übergeben, sie wurden implementiert mit einem guten Vorsatz: wenn ihr nach den Geboten lebt, könnt ihr euch entwickeln, wenn nicht, gibt es Strafen, die bis zur Vernichtung gehen können. Die Menschenvölker sind verschieden, haben sich verschieden entwickelt. Um möglichst viele Menschen ansprechen zu können, wurden verschiedene Religionen geschaffen - von einem Gott!

Seit 1830 gibt es die Religion der Mormonen. Sie ist die der Welt jüngste Religion: Kirche Jesu Christi der Heiligen der letzten Tage. Das Wirken des Herrn Jesus Christus wird hier als Erretter der Welt gewürdigt. Sein Prophet war Joseph Smith (USA, 1805-1844). Er übersetzte den Text von den Metallplatten (1827-1830) ins Englische, die er vom Engel Moroni erhalten und ihm nach Beendigung der Arbeit wieder abgegeben hatte: Das Buch Mormon - ein weiterer Zeuge für Jesus Christus, die Heilige Schrift der Mormonen - das über 5 Millionen Anhänger repräsentiert.

Der Koran ist die Heilige Schrift der Mohammedaner. Er wurde von Mohammed (570-632) in den Jahren 610 bis 632 (n. Chr.) als Offenbarungen Allahs (mit Hilfe des Engel Gabriel, Heiliger Geist als Bote Allahs) verfaßt und verkündet. Mohammed spricht arabisch zu seinen Landleuten, damit sie Allahs Wort verstehen können. Der Urkoran ist bei Allah (im Himmel). Im Islam, mit mehr als 600 Millionen Anhängern, haben die hochgeehrte Jungfrau Maria -Mutter Jesu- und Jesu, als bevorzugter Prophet Allahs, ihre Bedeutung. Im Islam gibt es zwei Glaubensrichtungen: die Sunniten und die Schiiten.

Die christliche Religion hat ihre Wurzeln weit vor der Geburt Jesu im Alten Testament. Die Geburt Jesu leitete eine neue Etappe ein, die des Neuen Testaments. Engel Gabriel hat das mit Maria im Auftrage Gottes vorbereitet (Lukas 1). Die Reformation der katholischen Kirche durch Martin Luther führte zum evangelischen Glauben - zwei Glaubensrichtungen.

Die Religion der Juden basiert auf dem Alten Testament. Allah ist der arabische Name des Eingottes, der bei den Juden schon einige Jahrtausende den Namen Jahwe = Jehovah führte.

Die Religionen sind eine Lebenshilfe. Der Glaube an den jeweiligen Gott kann für den einzelnen Menschen eine wichtige Hilfe sein. Ihm kann er seine Sorgen, Nöte und Freude mitteilen, kann Wünsche aussprechen, auch wenn er sonst keinen Ansprechpartner hat. Das geschieht im Allgemeinen durch das Gebet. Beten bedeutet auch, die Hoffnung nicht aufgeben. Psychologen wissen, wie wichtig es ist, daß man sich aussprechen kann. Das erleichtert, das gibt neuen Lebensmut, schafft Freiräume für neue Taten.

Der Glaube an Gott ist Anleitung zur Selbsthilfe. Im Prinzip spielt es keine Rolle, in welcher Religion und Sprache das Gebet erfolgt. Auch Menschen die keiner Religion angehören, einen entsprechenden Willen zum Ausdruck bringen, können den gleichen Effekt erreichen.

Wieviele Menschen wissen eigentlich, daß viele Religionen gemeinsame Wurzeln haben, nicht nur die katholische und evangelische Kirche, wo sich die Menschen teilweise auch nicht verstehen.

Der Prophet Ezechiel (12) gibt zu bedenken: "Diese Leute haben Augen und wollen nicht sehen, haben Ohren und wollen nicht hören!"

Die Menschen sollen "... davon überzeugt werden, daß Jesus der Christus ist, der ewige Gott, der sich allen Nationen kundtut.- Und wenn darin Mängel sind, so sind es die Fehler von Menschen..." Das Buch Mormon.

"Allah liebt die nicht, welche über das Ziel schießen."
Koran II. Sure, Vers [191].

Die Menschen bekämpfen sich, die in ihren Ursprüngen alle an den gleichen Jesus glauben. Jede Kriegspartei betet zu dem selben Gott: Laß uns gewinnen und vernichte die anderen. Der Haß gegenüber Andersgläubigen hat mit dem Anliegen der Religion(en) meiner Meinung nach nichts zu tun, er widerspricht ihr. Die Religionen (Berichte über das Leben, Erfahrungen, Hinweise) wurden den Menschen übergeben, um ihnen eine Richtschnur für ihr Handeln zu zeigen: so könnt ihr leben (z.B. 10 Gebote), aber wenn ihr nicht danach lebt, seid ihr gestraft - und da gibt es genug Beispiele.

Die Menschheit hat das Wissen, sich durch Krieg, Raub, Mord und Umweltverbrechen um ihre Existenz zu bringen (Gott hat seine Schöpfung "dahingegeben", Römer 1,18ff -?) - oder durch sinnvolle Anwendung der Wissenschaft zu überleben und unsere Erde zu einem blühenden Garten für alle zu machen. I have stood on the Golan and felt the fierce determination to always keep my ancestral homeland safe and secure. I have filled the cracks of the Wall with prayers of hope and thanksgiving. I have felt the spray of the Kinneret on my face and have stood on the shores of Eilat. I have climbed to the heights of Masada and have sung at an ancient tel. I have stood at the crest of Jerusalem and have surveyed the city my grandparents could only dream about, but never see.

I have welcomed the Sabbath on the shores of the Red Sea. I have recited the Maamar Kaddish at Yad Vashem and have wept at Children's Pavilion. I have put my hands to its soil to plant trees - the symbol of eternal life.

My academic life has been dedicated to the study of the Holocaust. It is my dream to one day settle in Israel and work at Yad Vashem to educate future generations so that in the famous words of the Page int' the world, will not be condemned to repeat history.

I recently returned from a trip to Eastern Europe where, in Kiev, I stood at the crest of Babi Yar where thousands of innocent Jews ~~were~~ were murdered by the Nazis. Standing there in a cold, silent rain the importance of Israel as a beacon of hope, dignity and security was once again illuminated in my mind and heart.

I have put all of these thoughts down on paper today in the hope that they will in some way help to express my gratitude admiration and respect to and for you. You will most certainly go down in history as a true hero, for you have dared to do what many have been destined to remain bullwark the time while our precious Israel continued to struggle in a world of hatred and death.

No one knows what lies ahead for Israel, the P.L.O. or her neighbors. What I do know is this: because of you there is hope; because of you we will be able hear the shouts of laughing children instead of the wails of grieving mothers; because of you we can look to the peace of the future not the violence and hatred of the past; because of you there can be, at last Shalom b'Yisrael Peace. 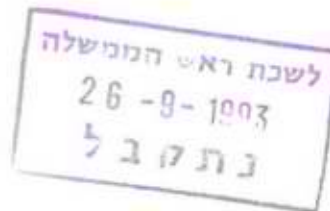

I just watched on television as the two of you signed your Middle East **peace** agreement at the White House today.

In the late 1960s I was in the American Army. Though many soldiers who shared my barracks or my office had left and gone to Vietnam, I remained in Germany and was grateful that I had been left behind, not least because of my German fiancée. Still, each month we had an "alert" during which all personnel changed into duty uniform, were issued weapons, and climbed into vehicles ready to run away from the Russian tank assault we thought we had to be prepared for. In February 1967 the alert changed. While we all sat in our trucks or jeeps the word passed quickly that we were to go to the Rhine-Main air base to be transported to Israel to help in the war. But before dawn broke, the commanding officer of the small post went to each driver to announce "the war is over!"

Twenty years ago my German wife and I were living in Tokyo. We learned that it was traditional for citizens to file into the Imperial Palace during the first few days of the new year to wish the emperor well. And at one point, American I and German she stood inside the stone walls. We each had a Japanese flag in hand, and I realized we were waving them in honor of one of the first faces I had been taught to hate. As though World War II had never really happened.

My wish for your children, and their children, is that they will never have interesting stories like these to tell.

And my very personal thanks to both of you for having given me such a magnificent present on this, my 53rd birthday.

Middle East: Arafat and Rabin seem close to a historic breakthrough. But already firebrands on both sides are out in force against them.

HE IS THE TERRORIST PERSONIFIED. NO, HE IS A FREEDOM fighter. He is a statesman, the founding father of a homeless nation that has endured the wilderness for 45 years. No, he is a ruthless plotter who orders the killing of babies. The Palestinians and Israelis both need someone like Yasir Arafat—national hero and national demon. To millions beyond the Middle East, he is an instantly recognizable figure, with his stubby face, the pistol on his hip, the checkerboard kaffiyeh hiding his bald head. After decades on display, Arafat, 64, is more than a little shopworn. His organization is nearly bankrupt, his power is fading and his supporters are slipping away. His enemies are legion, inside and outside the Palestinian movement. But Arafat is an escape artist, a wily survivor. He has at least one more gamble in him, one desperate attempt to restore his standing and redeem the promises he couldn't keep.

His rescuers turn out to be two other old men, also approaching the end of their careers, also seeking one last chance to change stalemate into triumph. Israeli Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin, 71, is a bleakly pragmatic military man who spent decades cracking Arab skulls and now wants to be known as a peacemaker. His foreign minister and longtime political rival, Shimon Peres, 70, is an idealistic intellectual, a tireless searcher for peace who strikes some Israelis as a washed-up political hack. Each an adversary of the other two, the three old men are the unlikely partners in what could be the most dramatic Mideast breakthrough since Anwar Sadat's mission to Jerusalem 16 years ago. But then, as Rabin put it, "Peace is not made with friends. Peace is made with enemies."

Their negotiating breakthrough was reminiscent of communism's collapse—the unthinkable suddenly and hopefully at hand. For years, the Arabs and Israelis had been models of intransigence, lurching from desert battlefield to barren peace table and back again. With the end of the cold war, the world changed around them, weakening Arafat but also sapping Rabin's sense of security. Spiritually exhausted, they acted out of a desperate sense that time and opportunity were slipping away. If a compromise could not be achieved now, Rabin and Arafat would be overtaken by extremists on both sides—Israeli hard-liners and Muslim fundamentalists.

The three old enemies stole a march on the opponents of compromise by authorizing secret negotiations—in Norway, of all places. They left Washington almost entirely out of the loop, turning to the Americans for political and financial support only after they had cut their deal. They abandoned long-held positions. Israel finally dealt directly with Arafat's Palestine Liberation Organization, after years of insisting it would never do so. PLO negotiators settled for gradual autonomy, instead of an immediate Palestinian

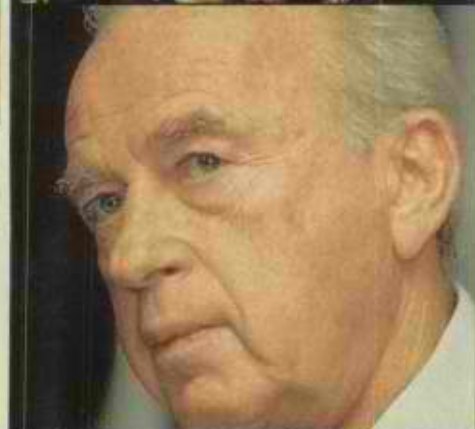

state, in territory now occupied by Israel.

Last week a draft of their agreement on Palestinian autonomy was published, and the parties seemed to be on the verge of signing it. Instead, they haggled over the crucial side issue of mutual recognition. In effect, Arafat had long since conceded Israel's right to exist, free from terrorism and the threat of extermination. But now the promise had to be made explicitly, and by late in the week, the parties were still groping for words, giving their critics time to undercut the deal. The agreement may yet be signed this week or next, probably without a face-to-face meeting of all three old enemies. But delay could doom the peace plan, now that firebrands on both sides are out in force against it.

In Israel, Jewish settlers demonstrated angrily, calling Rabin a "traitor." A group of right-wing rabbis warned about "a civil war that is likely to break out as a result of [the government's] dangerous and crazy steps." In the occupied territories, Hamas, the rapidly growing Islamic Resistance Movement, warned darkly: "We will never agree to be part of this game." In Damascus, Ahmed Jabril, an extremist Palestinian warlord with links to Iran, threatened to

kill Arafat. "Arab terrorism and the Jewish reaction will smash this agreement to pieces," predicted Eliakim Haetzni, a leader of the West Bank settlers.

If it survives, the agreement would establish a five-year interim period of Palestinian self-rule, starting in the Gaza Strip and the ancient West Bank city of Jericho (map, page 23). The Israeli military would withdraw from Arab population centers, and the Palestinians would elect a governing council. The agreement left for later the most difficult issues, including control over Jerusalem and the status of the 120,000 Jewish settlers in the occupied territories. If the agreement is signed, it may be quickly matched by separate settlements between Israel and three Arab neighbors: Jordan, Syria and Lebanon. "The horizons to peace are open," Rabin declared.

What made peace possible was the fact that Arafat's horizons had narrowed. The breakup of the Soviet Union had deprived him of his superpower patron. Now, in Bill Clinton, he faced probably the most pro-Israeli U.S. president in recent memory. The war in the Persian Gulf had been politically and financially ruinous for Arafat. He backed the wrong horse, Iraq's Saddam Hussein, and

lost his access to the deep pockets of Saudi Arabia and the other gulf states. The PLO went almost broke, its billions of dollars in reserves nearly depleted. Supporters within the PLO began to drift away from Arafat. "This organization is finished, whether you go with the settlement to the end or drop out of the settlement now," said poet Mahmoud Darwish, who recently resigned from the PLO's executive committee.

The price of unity: As Arafat faded, the fundamentalists gathered strength. Estimates of their support in the occupied territories hovered around 35 percent. Arafat tried to co-opt the militants. Their price for joining forces with him was 40 percent of the seats on the Palestine National Council, the PLO's Parliament in exile, and a similar share of the 18-member executive committee. They also demanded that Arafat return to his old policy toward Israel: the dream of reconquering all of Palestine. The fundamentalists, in short, would settle for nothing less than co-opting Arafat. Instead, the PLO leader turned to the Israelis.

He found them more receptive than ever. In last year's Israeli election, Rabin and his Labor Party had run against the conservative Likud bloc on what amounted to a peace platform endorsed by Washington. Israeli voters expected results from Rabin, the general who led Israeli forces to victory in 1967. "As the one who brought all the territories to Israel, and as a symbol of war in Israel, he personally wants to enter history as a hero of
