



Dear Prime Minister Y. Rabin,

after what happened in Tel Aviv my sympathy for the Jewish and Palestinian people is greater than it ever has been. The peace-process is a great challenge and very important - if everything seems hopeless today I know you will succeed in the end. And many people all over the world who never have taken a stand in this matter before will now wake up and a flow of disgust will meet the people who are trying to interfere the peace-process. The extreme muslims, the fundamentalists, will also sooner or later discover that they have moderate muslims against them - men, women and children who want to be free and get out of the Prison of Islam. It's good to know that the Holy War will come to an end and Israel will eventually triumph over her Arab enemies before the end of the 20th Century - the end of the sun. But the extreme elements in Israel who are against the Israeli Government and the peace-process must not interfere and take up arms - this is the worst thing that can happen, it means Civil War. You must remember that 75% of the Palestinian people want peace, the other 25%, belong to Hamas and other brainwashed groups. I'm also afraid that a murder of Arafat will end in a Civil War - a Civil War will make a free way for the extreme muslims in Iran, Iraq, Libya and Arabia to take part in it and a Third World War will break out - a new strategy is therefore of a vital importance for Israel, Jordan, Palestine - and also Lebanon and Syria - blind terror and killing of innocent people must stop. In Beirut, for instance, the Iran fundamentalists have a school for Palestinian children where they are being brain-washed and learn to hate - take the children out of these schools and back to a safe place where they can learn good things about life and they'll be grateful for that. The young man who killed himself in the bus-explosion in Tel Aviv is a product of the fundamentalists inveteracy and ignorance. It should also be all impor-

-tant for Arafat and his people to find and eleminate these misleaders who have seduced so many of his own people for a very long time. Maybe it's possible to infiltrate Hammas by some of his own people? You must work together as a team of good surgeons who are saving a dear friend who has been wounded by your worst enemies. And Iran, Iraq and Libya are your worst enemies. All of you who are searching for peace should take David's words for granted and put it in your mind: "The LORD said to my LORD. Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies my foot-stool."

I know very well that a solution for peace is not made in one day after so many years of hate, strife and spilling of blood, but I know for certain that the only way to peace is reconciliation and co-operation - then the Isralian soldiers can say to the Palestinian children who are throwing stones in the streets - do you want to go to school and learn to read and write or do you want to throw stones? When hate is darkening the soul one can't any longer see the difference of a friend and an enemy, and that's why so many innocent people on both sides have been killed and suffer - the killing of old people and children will never bring peace but a hindrance to obtain peace. I look for the day when Israel, Jordan, Palestine (judea) and Syria as well - and people from Libanon - go together to chase the intruders from Iran and other Arabian countries out. Then a new law will occupy a new land around Syria, Judea and Palestine. The great barbarian Empire will crumble before the century of the sun is finished.

Some may say that the peace-process is hanging in a thin thread - yes, but a very strong one, ready to be lifted up by God's finger - too high to be reached by the priest-regime in Iran or other in the world who want to stop the peace-process. A peace will also means better times for the Jews who have suffered so much persecution and intolerance throughout history - peace in the Middle East means a new and a better day to-morrow for the whole mankind. God bless your efforts!

Israel advarer Syria

Den amerikanske fredsmegleren

Dennis Ross kom i går til Syrias hovedstad Damaskus. Med seg hadde han en advarsel fra Israel.

Jerusalem.

Israel holder, i hvert fall delvis, Syria ansvarlig for at fem israelske soldater ble drept i den såkalte sikkerhetssonen i Sor-Libanon forrige uke. Den spente atmosfæren i sonen har tilspisset seg og er nær kokepunktet, muligens en eksplosjon.

Sikkerhetssonen er landområdet i Sor-Libanon som siden 1982 er blitt patruljert av rundt 1000 israelske soldater og 2500 soldater fra Den Sor-Libanesiske Armé (SLA). Sonen har fungert tilfredsstillende som vern mot infiltrasjon og direkte angrep mot bebyggelsen innenfor israelsk grense. Men flere ganger er både israelske og libanesiske soldater blitt drept i geriljaaangrep gjennomført av den iransk-støttede Hizbollah-militisen og palestinske grupper med base i Syria. Disse gruppene er svorne motstandere av fredsprosessen i Midt-Østen.

Forverret situasjon

Forrige uke forverret situasjonen seg. I løpet av to dager ble fem israelske soldater drept og fem såret i to angrep. Det første angrepet skjedde torsdag og ble utført av «PFLP-Generalkommando» som ledes av

Achmed Jibril og har hovedkvarter i Damaskus. Organisasjonen er en utbrytergruppe fra Den palestinske frigjøringsorganisasjonen (PLO) og aviser PLO-leder Yasir Arafats mer moderate linje i forhold til Israel. Hizbollah-militisen har innrømmet at de sto bak fredagens angrep.

Israels statsminister Yitzhak Rabin sendte i går en klar advarsel til Syria. Israel kommer til å gjøre alt som er nødvendig for å verne om landets sikkerhet, uavhengig av fredsforshandlingene, sa Rabin. Han hevdet også at Hizbollah og Jibrils organisasjon samarbeider og «bruker våpen som de får fra Iran via Damaskus.»

Hevnaksjoner?

Derned reiste Rabin en anklagende pekefinger mot de syriske lederne. Det er rundt 40 000 syriske soldater i Libanon, et land Damaskus betrakter som sin politiske og strategiske bakgård. Syrerne har hittil nølt med å holde Hizbollah og de palestinske utbryterorganisasjonene i temme. Damaskus mener at så lenge de retter sine angrep mot den såkalte sikkerhetssonen, bør de betraktes som geriljasoldater i kamp for å befri israelsk-okkupert område i Libanon.

Den store faren nå er at Israel gjennomfører hevnaksjoner som så kan føre til direkte konfrontasjon med syriske tropper. Det er ingen tvil om at Dennis Ross vil formidle Israels advarsel til syrerne og til president Hafez Assad personlig.

Fornebu intet alternativ

Hans Lunder stiller meg noen konkrete spørsmål i Aftenposten 1.7. vedrørende Fornebu som alternativ til utvidelsen av Filipstad-terminalen.

I forbindelse med at Miljøverndepartementet utredet mulig etterbruk av Fornebu i 1991 ble også havneformål vurdert. Oslo havnevesen har meddelt sine synspunkter i den forbindelse til departementets konsulent, Asplan.

I sitt innlegg tillegger Lunder Oslo havnevesen avvisningen av Fornebu som alternativ samt argumentasjonen for dette. Dersom han hadde satt seg bedre inn i saken, ville han sett at det refererte sitat ikke stammer fra oss, men fra Asplans rapport. Således er det konsulentens konklusjon på grunnlag av alle relevante forhold.

Som planorgan for havneutbygging i Oslo finner Oslo havnevesen det forevig ikke korrekt å uttrykke meninger om hvordan Bærum kommune bør disponere sine arealer. Ei hel lever drive planlegging i annen kommunens områder.

En side ved herr Lunders synspunkter er det nødvendig å imøtegå. I forbindelse med at en eventuell utbygging på Fornebu lett kunne nærme seg en prislapp på én milliard, synes han å tro at havneutbygging i Oslo akjer ved hjelp av kommune- eller statskassen og at man derfor gjerne kunne bruke penger ut fra en rekke havnevedkommende argumenter. Slik er det ikke. Havneutbygging i Oslo skjer utelukkende for havnekassens regning, dvs. utelukkende ved hjelp av avgifter og vederlag som havnens brukere erlegger. Dette setter selvsagt grenser for hva som rent økonomisk kan forsvares av investeringer. Filipstad med sine ca. 350 millioner ligger innenfor grensen.

Tenk nytt!

Partene har gått i skyttergravene og forsvarer med nebb og klør sine oppfatninger og stemmegivninger om containerhavn på Filipstad. Det gis ikke noe slingringsmonn. Partene er skråsikre i sine standpunkter.

Som formann i Oslo vennstre i 12 år frem til 1988, kjenner jeg relativt godt til Havnevesenets behov for større arealer. Containerhavn forutsetter betydelig arealbehov. Dette har vært Oslo Havnevesens hodepine i mange år. De mest omfattende planer var å gjøre Ormøya og Malmøya til havneområder. Disse planene ble forlatt etter iherdige protester fra befolkningens side, og det ble inngått en *gentlemen's agreement*. Havneutbyggingen skulle stoppe ved Ormsundet.
