



Dear President Reagan:

The United Nations, in November of 1975, passed Resolution 3379. The resolution embodied a false perception of Zionism and should immediately be revoked by the United Nations.

The resolution reads, in part:

Taking note also of the of the Political Declaration and Strategy to Strengthen International Peace and Security and to Intensify Solidarity and Mutual Assistance among Non-Aligned Countries, adopted at the Conference of Ministers for Foreign Affairs of Non-Aligned Countries held at Lima from 25 to 30 August 1975, which most severely condemned zionism as a threat to world peace and security and called upon all countries to oppose this racist and imperialist ideology.

Determines that zionism is a form of racism and racial discrimination.

The United States opposed the resolution then -- and should now review its efforts to revoke it.

Zionism has always vigorously espoused the cause of human freedom and equality and should be recognized for that commitment by the United Nations.

THE PROCLAMATIONS OF THE GOVERNORS OF THE UNITED STATES: A LANDMARK IN ZIONIST AND AMERICAN JEWISH HISTORY

“Proclaim Liberty Throughout the Land and to All the Inhabitants Thereof” is the inspiring inscription from Leviticus on the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia’s Independence Hall. On the escutcheons of three of this nation’s oldest and most prestigious universities, Harvard, Yale and Columbia are selected Hebrew words. In Colonial America, both before and after the war for independence, the contributions of the Jewish people and their Prophets to human dignity, social justice, and democracy was strikingly manifest in the sermons of the Colonies’ foremost theologians, intellectuals and leaders in the struggle for independence, and the formulation of the constitution of the infant republic.

Gershom Mendes Seixas, Rabbi of the Spanish-Portuguese Synagogue, Shearith Israel, was one of the religious leaders who administered the oath of office to George Washington. And the Father of our Country has a unique place in American-Jewish history for his remarkable letter to the Judah Touro Synagogue at Newport, Rhode Island, giving to “bigotry no sanction.”

The identification of the Jews with democratic values, freedom, civil rights and equality for all its citizens has been woven into the tapestry that is the American ethos, history and heritage. This is the very aura and patina bequeathed to the Zionist movement and preserved inviolate by all Zionists everywhere.

On November 10, 1975 the United Nations General Assembly Resolution 3379 perpetrated a vicious attempt to deny fact with the monstrous lie that “Zionism is Racism.”

In November 1984 a worldwide campaign to refute this infamous canard was launched by the World Zionist Organization Information Department headed by General Uzi Narkiss. As Chairman of the WZO in the United States, it was my privilege, one month later, to take the initiative in arranging an impressive Human Rights Day Seminar at the U.S. State Department in the nation’s capital. Its purpose was to launch this campaign in the United States. Simultaneously in several other capitals throughout the world, action was begun along similar lines. As a result of this educational campaign, in the summer of 1985, the United States Senate and House of Representatives joined in unanimously issuing Resolution 98 condemning U.N.G.A. Resolution 3379 and requested the United States Ambassador and Delegation to the U.N. “to take all appropriate actions necessary to erase this shameful resolution from the record of the United Nations.”

President Ronald Reagan added the weight and prestige of his office to our efforts when he joined the Congress in declaring his abhorrence of UNGA 3379 as a “total inversion of morality.”





Consider UNGA Resolution 3379 to be itself a form of bigotry and, therefore, inconsistent with the declared purposes of the United Nation;
Affirm that the people of the State of Kansas will not tolerate bigotry of any kind; and
Call upon the General Assembly of the United Nations to repudiate Resolution 3379 forthwith.

A Proclamation by the Governor

WHEREAS, ON NOVEMBER 10, 1975, THE UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY PASSED AN INFAMOUS RESOLUTION EQUATING ZIONISM WITH RACISM. AMERICANS OF CONSCIENCE, INCLUDING THE PRESIDENT, SENATE, AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES, HAVE UNEQUIVOCALLY CONDEMNED RESOLUTION 3379 AS A PERVERSION OF JUSTICE, A DISTORTION OF THE UNITED NATIONS CHARTER, AND A MOCKERY OF THE DEMOCRATIC IDEALS UPON WHICH OUR NATION STANDS; AND

WHEREAS, ZIONISM, THE MOVEMENT WHICH BROUGHT THE STATE OF ISRAEL INTO BEING, IS BASED ON A COMMITMENT TO FREEDOM, HUMAN RIGHTS, AND THE FUNDAMENTAL EQUALITY OF ALL PEOPLE. LIKE OUR OWN COUNTRY, ISRAEL HAS WELCOMED REFUGEES FLEEING PERSECUTION FROM AROUND THE WORLD. MOST RECENTLY IT ABSORBED THOUSANDS OF ETHIOPIANS, A CLEAR DEMONSTRATION OF ITS BELIEF IN RACIAL EQUALITY. OVER THE YEARS, THE STATE OF ISRAEL HAS PROVEN TO BE A CONSISTENT ALLY OF THE UNITED STATES, AS WELL AS AN EXAMPLE OF HUMAN DIGNITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE FOR THE ENTIRE MIDDLE EAST; AND

WHEREAS, RESOLUTION 3379 WAS AN ATTEMPT TO DELEGITIMIZE THE VERY EXISTENCE OF THE STATE OF ISRAEL. IT WAS PROMOTED BY AN ARRAY OF DICTATORIAL GOVERNMENTS, HOSTILE TO THE PRINCIPLES OF DEMOCRACY AND PEACEFUL COEXISTENCE AMONG NATIONS. SINCE ITS PASSAGE, THE RESOLUTION HAS BEEN USED AS A JUSTIFICATION BY TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS TO COMMIT ACTS OF VIOLENCE, AND HAS FOSTERED A PERNICIOUS BRAND OF ANTI-SEMITISM BY FALSELY ACCUSING THE JEWISH PEOPLE, SO OFTEN VICTIMS OF RACIAL HATRED, OF THEMSELVES COLLECTIVELY PERPETRATING A SYSTEMATIC FORM OF RACISM; AND

WHEREAS, THE STATE OF NEVADA IS A HOME TO INDIVIDUALS OF ALL RACES AND CREEDS. THE CITIZENS OF NEVADA, LIKE ALL AMERICANS, UNDERSTAND THE IMPORTANCE OF TOLERANCE AND MUTUAL RESPECT AMONG PEOPLES. U.N. GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 3379 DIRECTLY CONTRADICTS THAT UNDERSTANDING;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICHARD H. BRYAN, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, DO HEREBY:

CONDEMN ANY LINKAGE BETWEEN ZIONISM AND RACISM;

CONSIDER UNGA RESOLUTION 3379 TO BE ITSELF A FORM OF BIGOTRY AND, THEREFORE, INCONSISTENT WITH THE DECLARED PURPOSES OF THE UNITED NATIONS;

AFFIRM THAT THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA WILL NOT TOLERATE
BIGOTRY OF ANY KIND; AND

CALL UPON THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS TO REPUDIATE
RESOLUTION 3379 FORTHWITH.



